It's difficult to truly appreciate how our FEPOW must have felt as time went on and they were faced with yet another Christmas in captivity. Yet they somehow managed to put together concerts in some of the camps which undoubtably raised their morale and helped to overcome the longing to be home.

In 1944 the POWs in Nong Pladuk were able to put on a Christmas show and it must have been an enormous boost to their morale to have some entertainment to take their minds off their situation. Nong Pladuk was one of the larger base and administration camps on the Thai-Burma railway and it was initially built to house up to 2000 prisoners but, as time went by, the number increased to around 8,000 and the camp was split in two and numbered No.1 and No.2. British, Australian and American prisoners were held in Camp 1, while prisoners from the Netherlands were held in No.2 camp. 
Chapter 7. "The Show Must Go On": Nong Pladuk Relocation Camp Sears Eldredge

Sham Shui Po is a district in Hong Kong and it was used by the IJA during WWII as a prison camp for British, Indian and Canadian soldiers. Many prisoners died here especially during an outbreak of diphtheria in 1942, so it's good to see that here too they were able to organise and put on entertainment for the POWs.

And so, now we are approaching Christmas 2021 and, as FEPOW descendants, we will be thinking of what the festive season must have been like for our loved ones. Keith Bettany has very kindly sent me a link to a menu that his father, Des, had designed for that very first Christmas that they spent in captivity in 1942. What a miserable, frightening, uncertain and lonely time that must have been for them in the various camps that they were held in across the Far East! In many countries around the globe they were being missed and worried about by their families and loved ones who were often still unsure of their loved one's fate and even where they were or if they were safe - as we share our Christmas lunch together at our December meeting, lets take a few moments to think of them and to remember how different it was for them - We Will Remember Them!





As Christmas comes and goes we look forward on to 2022 and we are still facing the uncertainty for the future as the Covid Pandemic still keeps a grip on the world's population. So, on behalf of the BAFEPOW Committee, I would like to wish everyone, everywhere a Happy New Year and hope that we all stay safe and keep well, also that we will keep in touch and remember our FEPOW together.
