### The Word



#### How long can we survive without eating?

□ 1 Day □ 3 Days □ 10 Days □ 20 Days □ 40 Days □ 60 Days

If you checked "1 day," then you never missed a meal in your life!

- No, it's not even 10 or 20 days. We can survive 40 days without food. After that, our bodies begin to starve and death is not far off.
- Just as our physical body needs food to grow and survive, our spirit also needs to be fed.

"...man doth not live by bread only,

but by every word that proceedeth out of the mouth of the Lord doth man live."

Deuteronomy 8:3

❖ Underline what we need for life – in addition to food.



- Food gives strength to our physical bodies.
- Similarly, God's Word gives us power to live a victorious Christian life.

#### The Source of the Word

"Knowing this first, that

no prophecy of the Scripture is of any private interpretation. For the prophecy came not in old time by the will of man: but holy men of God spake as they were moved by the Holy Ghost."

2 Peter 1:20-21



- **Underline** *two* ways prophecy did **not** come.
- **Circle** who is the Source of the Word.

God guided the authors of the Bible about what to write. They didn't come up with the ideas themselves.

### The Purpose of the Word

"And many other signs truly did Jesus in the presence of His disciples, which are not written in this book:

But these are written,

that ye might believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God; and that believing ye might have life through His name."

John 20:30-31

- ❖ Circle why the book of John was written.
- ❖ Underline what happens when we "believe that Jesus is the Christ."
- ♦ The disciple John wrote the **Gospel of John** so people would believe in Jesus.
- ♦ The disciple John later wrote **1 John** so people who believed in Jesus would know they had eternal life. **See 1 John 5:13**.



- ♣ Written by about 40 men over a period of 1600 years (1500 B.C. to A.D. 100).
- ♣ The authors had a variety of occupations, including:
  - ~ Shepherd / King (David)
  - ~ Prophet (Isaiah)
  - ~ Priest (Ezra)
  - ~ Tax collector (Matthew)
  - ~ **Doctor** (Luke)
  - ~ Fishermen (Peter, John)
  - ~ Tent maker (Paul)
- ♣ First major book printed in Europe on new Gutenberg printing press in 1455.
- ♣ Best-selling and most widely distributed book of all time.
- ♣ Most translated book

in the world (at least one book of the Bible translated into over 2,400 languages).



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"All Scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness: That the man of God may be perfect, thoroughly furnished unto all good works." 2 Timothy 3:16-17

- **Circle** how *much* Scripture is inspired by God. This verse teaches that all of the Bible originates from God!
- **Underline** the result of applying the Word to our life.
- **Frame** how *many* "good works" we will be "furnished" (equipped) for.



"For whatsoever things were written aforetime were written for our learning, that we through patience and comfort of the Scriptures might have hope."

Romans 15:4

- **Underline** why the Bible was "written."
- **Circle** what "patience" and "comfort of the Scriptures" bring.

"Thy word is a lamp unto my feet, and a light unto my path."

Psalm 119:105

❖ Underline *two* descriptions of what God's Word is like.



A flashlight helps you safely find your way when it is dark. In the same way, the Bible is like a lamp or a light which helps you "see" to make wise decisions.

"Wherewithal shall a young man cleanse his way? by taking heed thereto according to Thy word."

Psalm 119:9

**Underline** how to "cleanse" your way.

"Beware of reasoning about God's Word – **obey** it." ~ Oswald Chambers

#### The **Power** of the Word

"And when the tempter [Satan] came to Him [Jesus], he said,

If thou be the Son of God, command that these stones be made bread. But He answered and said.

It is written, Man shall not live by bread alone,

but by every word that proceedeth out of the mouth of God." Matthew 4:3-4

- ❖ Circle what Satan said to Jesus.
- **Underline** how Jesus responded to Satan's temptation.

Notice how Jesus quoted **Deuteronomy 8:3** – the passage at the start of this lesson. Because Jesus was already familiar with this verse, He was able to quote it when tempted.

❖ Circle how the "word of God" is described in Ephesians 6:17.

The "word of God" is the only offensive weapon listed in Ephesians 6:11-17, a passage about the Armor of God.

A Christian who studies the Bible can use it to defeat his spiritual enemies. However, a Christian who is not familiar with the Bible has a weapon closer to the size of a *pocket knife* instead of a *sword!* 

### The Application of the Word

#### Memorize

"Thy word have I hid in mine heart, that I might not sin against Thee."

Psalm 119:11

- \* Circle where we should hide God's Word.
  - ♦ We hide God's Word in our hearts because we *treasure* it!
- **Underline** what God's Word helps us avoid doing.

"Heart" refers to our mind, soul, conscience, emotions, passions, will, and desires. Memorizing the Bible is more than a mental exercise. It should affect your entire life.

#### **Meditate**

**Meditating** on God's Word involves repeatedly reviewing a passage to absorb all the spiritual "nutrients" in it. One way is to:

- O Recite a verse over and over in your mind. Then...
- O **Emphasize** a different word each time to see how that word adds to the meaning of the entire verse.

"Blessed is the man that walketh not in the counsel of the ungodly, nor standeth in the way of sinners, nor sitteth in the seat of the scornful.

But his delight is in the law of the Lord; and in His law doth he meditate day and night. And he shall be like a tree planted by the rivers of water,

that bringeth forth his fruit in his season; his leaf also shall not wither; and whatsoever he doeth shall prosper."

Psalm 1:1-3



- ❖ Circle the *one word* in *Psalm 1* that describes the person who keeps himself from the *ungodly, sinners, and scornful*.
- Underline where this person finds his "delight."
- **Frame** what he does with God's Word.
- **Underline** what this person is compared to.
- **Circle** the result of this person's lifestyle.

- **Circle** how often the Psalmist meditated on God's Word.
- ❖ Underline what happens when we always keep God's commands with us.
- **Circle** what enables us to have "more understanding" than our teachers.
- **Underline** the way to "understand more than the ancients" (our elders).

"This book of the law shall not depart out of thy mouth;

but thou shalt meditate therein day and night,

that thou mayest observe to do according to all that is written therein:

for then thou shalt make thy way prosperous, and then thou shalt have good success."

Joshua 1:8



- ❖ Circle two times we are to "meditate" on Scripture.
- ❖ Underline *two* benefits of meditating and obeying Scripture.



These verses teach that obeying and meditating on God's Word are key to our success.

### **Application**

"But be ye doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving your own selves."

James 1:22

- **&** Circle what we should "do" with the Word.
- **Underline** what people who only hear the Word do to themselves.

"And why call ye me [Jesus], Lord, Lord, and do not the things which I say?"

Luke 6:46

- - It is hypocritical to call Jesus our Lord (or Master) but not obey Him.
  - ♦ Our actions speak louder than our words!

"Study to shew thyself approved unto God,
a workman that needeth not to be ashamed,
rightly dividing the word of truth." 2 Timothy 2:15



We study God's Word by reading, memorizing, and meditating on it.

Studying is *work*, but it enables us to become "workmen" who are not ashamed.

❖ Circle what we are to "rightly" divide. "Rightly dividing" means you accurately understand and apply the word of God.

We began by asking how **often** we need **to eat to survive**.

- Just as we need <u>daily nourishment</u> for a **healthy body**, we also need <u>daily intake of God's Word</u> to ensure a **healthy Spiritual life**.
- Too many Christians only hear God's Word once a week on Sundays.
- How often do you take time for God's Word?
- ? How could you improve?
