



Time Zone

Marbella, Spain is on Central European Time (CET), making it **several hours ahead** of your home time zone. The differences are as follows:

- ET = + 6 hours
- CT = + 7 hours
- ATL = + 7 hours
- MT = + 8 hours
- PT = + 9 hours

Climate

The temperature in the Marbella is delightful in November ranging from highs in the mid-60's to lows in the mid-50's.

Currency and Credit Cards

The Euro is the national currency for Spain. Credit cards (mainly Visa

and Mastercard) are widely accepted for purchases, and **all gratuities throughout your stay will be covered by us**, including caddy gratuities. For those who wish to have cash on hand, local currency is easily accessed at ATMs using a debit card, but not at the airport as fees tend to be higher. We recommend you **notify your bank** before you leave to let them know of your travel plans.

Electric Current & Converters

Spain's current is 220 volts, 50 cycles. The power plug sockets are type F, which uses two round pins. We will have converters available for you to charge your electronics in Spain. Hair dryers are provided in all hotel rooms.

PACKING NOTES & TIPS

Recommended Attire

- Casual attire is recommended during the day.
- Shorts are allowed at all courses, but no denim. All courses have a soft spikes policy.
- Sophisticated Casual attire-a dress shirt, slacks, and dress shoes-is required by the restaurants for group dinners.

Recommended Items To Pack

- NOTE: You will receive 4 polo shirts, 2 quarterzip pullovers and golf balls while in Spain.
- Any other Golf Attire as Desired
- Sunglasses

Valuables & Medications

As a precaution, carry your travel documents, valuables, and vital medicines with you, or in a carry-on bag.

Packing Tips

- Cushion easily wrinkled garments in "airy" plastic bags.
- Pack a change of clothes for a 24-hour period in your carry-on luggage in the event that your luggage is delayed.
- Include toiletries such as toothpaste and a toothbrush in your carry-on luggage so you may freshen up prior to your arrival in Spain.
- Unlike TSA policies, no liquids are allowed in your carry-on bag on international flights. Also, there will not be alternate TSA lines that you otherwise might be accustomed to.

Luggage Tags

Attach identification tags to all of your bags to expedite luggage handling at airports and hotels.

You might also want to include identification information inside each piece of luggage in the event the outer tags are lost in handling.



IMPROVE YOUR TRAVEL EXPERIENCE

Check Luggage Restrictions

Luggage allowances vary from airline to airline. Check with your carrier about the number of bags allowed, dimensions and weight restrictions, including golf clubs.

- Golf clubs are considered one of your two allowed pieces of checked luggage.
- Carry-on luggage is generally limited to one per person along with one personal item such as a briefcase or handbag. It must be small enough to fit in the overhead bin or under the seat (approximate size: 10" x 13" x 23").
- In some cases, Transportation Security Administration (TSA) screeners will have to open your baggage as part of the screening process. If you choose to lock your bag, be sure to use TSA-approved locks.

Destination Airport

You will be flying into Malaga, Spain. Please make certain your luggage is checked through to the Malaga International Airport (AGP).

Before You Go

- Print off necessary **documents** beforehand (flight tickets, visa, important details, etc.)
- Note which **terminal** you're departing from.
- Check-in online ahead of time (usually 24 hours before departure).
- Weigh your bags the day before to ensure you're not over the limit.
- Download WhatsApp for secure and reliable free internet-based messaging for both Apple and Android devices. We will use this



- Android devices. **We will use this app** to communicate on a group chat. It can also help you stay in touch with family while you are away via text, voice or video calls. Query "WhatsApp" in the Apple App Store or Google Play to install on your mobile phone.
- For U.S. citizens, download the free Mobile
 Passport Control app to significantly expedite
 your customs process upon return to the U.S.
 You will no longer have to complete a paper
 customs form. (See instructions to follow.)



Mobile Passport Control (MPC) App



U.S. travelers can use the MPC to submit your travel document, photo, and customs declaration information through this free, secure app on your smartphone or other mobile device.

- Download the free app from the Apple App Store or Google Play.
- 2. Enter and save your traveler information.
- 3. You will use it on your return to the U.S.

TRAVEL DOCUMENTS

Airline Tickets

Your Airline Tickets have been arranged and emailed to you. **If you have not received them**, please contact Mark at Travel Headquarters immediately and they will be forwarded. Mark's direct number is (702) 265-7732.

Ticket Changes

Because of the rule restrictions on many airfares, changes to your flights (name changes, times, routing, etc.) at this time could result in penalties or higher airfares, imposed by the airlines, which would be passed on to you. Please inform us of any necessary changes so we can advise you of cost and seating availability.

Airline Check-In

Upon check-in, **you must present your passport and airline ticket.** Your international boarding pass will be issued at the ticket counter.

It is recommended that you **check in at least 90 minutes prior to departure** for a domestic flight and **approximately 3 hours prior** for an international flight.

Seat Assignments/Boarding Passes

All flights have been confirmed, ticketed, and every attempt has been made to confirm your seating preference. If you need to make any changes in seating arrangements, we suggest you check in early for your flight and arrange seating directly with the airlines.

Only ticketed passengers with a **driver's license, passport, or government-issued photo identification card and boarding pass** will be allowed beyond security checkpoints and onto the concourse and gate areas. U.S. travelers can find helpful info at **TSAtraveltips.us**.



ARRIVAL IN MALAGA

Upon arrival at the Malaga International Airport (AGP), you will be met outside the Baggage Claim/Customs area, and assisted with your luggage to awaiting transportation. We will travel to Santa Clara Golf Club in Marbella where we will have lunch at the Clubhouse and shoot 18 holes - shotgun start.

From there we will make our way to Puente Romano Beach Resort to settle in and meet for dinner at the resort's Chiringuito restaurant.

CHIRINGUITO - November 3rd

RETURNING HOME CUSTOMS & DUTY-FREE EXEMPTIONS BY COUNTRY

THE U.S. allows up to \$800 of merchandise duty-free per person, including 200 cigarettes, 100 cigars, and one liter of alcohol. (See cbp.gov/travel/uscitizens/know-before-you-go.) **MEXICO** allows duty-free merchandise up to \$500 US dollars, with a maximum of 10 cigarette packs, 25 cigars or 200 grams of tobacco; up to 3 liters of alcoholic beverages and 6 liters of wine. (See consulmex.sre.gob.mx.) **CANADA** allows duty-free merchandise up to CAN\$800, including 200 cigarettes, 50 cigars, 200 grams of manufactured tobacco and 200 tobacco sticks. You can bring back up to 1.5 liters of wine or 1.14 liters of alcoholic beverages or up to 8.5 liters of beer. (See travel.gc.ca.)
