

Nili Cohen, Israel Prize laureate for legal research, is President of the Israel Academy of Sciences and Humanities, and former Rector of Tel-Aviv University. Her research and teaching interests are private law, interface between private and public law, comparative law, and law and literature. As a student she was the founding and the chief co-editor of *Tel-Aviv University Law Review*. She directs the series on Law and Literature within the Institute of Advanced Legal Studies at Tel-Aviv University. She is a member of the American Law Institute and of Academia Aeropaea and was a member of the Committee of the Codification of Israeli Law. She is the recipient of Doukhan Prize, Sussman Prize (twice), Zeltner Prize, Rector's Prize for Excellence in Teaching (thrice), Minkoff Prize for Excellence in Law. She was awarded honorary professorship by the University of Buenos Aires and honorary doctorates by Haifa University and Ben Gurion University.
