



Introduction

The CIC ON Swiss Bike Cup is a national mountain bike series of international importance. The CIC On Swiss Bike Cup is based on the current regulations of the UCI and Swiss Cycling. Exceptions are regulated in the racing regulations of the CIC On Swiss Bike Cup. Changes to the regulations may be made in exceptional cases.

The Girls and boys start separately with an interval of one - three Kids:

minutes. Once the winner of the boys or girls has crossed the finish line, no further round can be started. The number of rounds

between girls and boys can vary.

Fun: Adults without a racing license will be divided into four fun

> categories. The Fun Men categories start with a gap of one - two minutes ahead of the Fun Seniors and Fun Women categories.

The Fun Easy Ride category starts at the end.

Licensed: The Juniors, Amateurs/Masters and Elite Men complete their own

race. The Juniors and the elite women start separately with a gap of one - three minutes. A race is considered over as soon as the winner of the respective category has crossed the finish line.


Laps: The final number of laps will be announced by the speaker before

Bib number distribution/training times

Race numbers/late registrations:

Saturday: from 08:00 a.m.

Sunday: from 08:00 a.m. until 60 minutes before the race or according to the announcement on the website. (Subject to change)

Training times on the race track:

The official training times apply, which are published on the website. If you train on the track during a race, you can be moved back on the grid. In the event of a recurrence, a starting handicap or disqualification may also be imposed.

Registration

The entry fees are:

KIDS: U9/U11/U13/U15/U17 CHF 30.-/race FUN: All Fun CHF 45.-/race

LICENSE: Jg. 06 + 07 (Jun.) CHF 40.-/race LICENSE: Year 05 + older CHF 45.-/race

Login Options:

Online registration (recommended)

Online registration platform with online registration and various payment methods on www.swissbikecup.ch.

Registration deadline is 1 week before the race, on Sunday, 11:59 p.m.

On-site registration (late registrations)

Up to 1 hour before the start you can register on site, if you register late on site, the late registration fee will be charged in addition to the entry fee.

Late registration fee CHF 20.00/race for adults (Cat. Fun/License) (from the registration deadline) CHF 10.00/race for children (Cat. Kids)

Accident insurance


Children (born 2008 - 2018):

As a rule, the children are also insured against accidents by the compulsory health insurance. The organizer disclaims any liability.

Adults (born 2007 and older):

The licensed drivers are insured against accidents by the license. The non-licensed fun riders contest the races at their own risk. The organizer, the umbrella organization and the sponsors disclaim any liability for unlicensed riders.





















Cancellation and procedure Category U9 & U11:

The CIC On Swiss Bike Cup for the U9 and U11 categories consists of seven events. The winners will be determined in skill courses (the child who has collected the most points on the course wins) and cross-country races. In the XC races, a race duration of approx. 4 - 8 minutes (U9) and 6 - 12 minutes (U11) is sought.

The winner is the one who has collected the most ranking points in both competitions.

Weighting competitions:

U9: Course 75%/Race 25% U11: Course 50%/Race 50%

In the event of a tie, the following criteria will determine the day's victory.

- 1. The better result from the course
- 2. The better time from the mass start race

In the case of the courses, the time required does not matter, as long as a mass start race is carried out.

The **race** in Gränichen is an exception. There is only one course. If only the course is carried out in a stage, the first thing that counts is the mistakes in the course and the second criterion is the time required.

Caregivers and parents are prohibited from entering the course during the competition. In the event of a violation, it may result in a points deduction.

The first 5 boys and 5 girls in each category usually receive a prize in kind at the award ceremonies.

Categories U13, U15 & U17:

The CIC On Swiss Bike Cup for the U13, U15 and U17 categories consists of seven events. The categories U13, U15 and U17 race on the cross-country course with an approximate race duration (winning time) of 25 to 35 minutes (U13), 35 to 45 minutes (U15) and 45 to 55 minutes (U17).

In the U17 category, only Swiss men and women are eligible to participate in the race in Echallens (Swiss Championships). The race is part of the overall ranking of the Swiss Bike Cup.

The first five boys and five girls in each category usually receive a prize in kind at the award ceremonies.

Category Fun:

The CIC On Swiss Bike Cup for the Fun categories consists of a total of seven events

Four categories are carried out:

Fun Women Fun Men **Fun Seniors** Easy Ride

The fun races are held for those born in 2006 and older who are **not** in possession of a racing license.

The duration of the cross-country races (winning time) should be between 45 and 60 minutes. The categories are ranked separately.

The Fun Easy Ride category completes one or two laps less than the Fun Men's category.

The first three men and three women in each category usually receive a prize in kind at the award ceremonies.

There will be no award ceremony for the "Fun Easy Ride" category.



















Category License:

The CIC On Swiss Bike Cup for the licence categories consists of a total of eight races.

The XCO and XCC Swiss Championships in Echallens do not count towards the overall ranking. Only Swiss citizens are eligible to participate in the Swiss Championships.

According to the UCI regulations, the following winning times are sought:

Cat. Juniors: 1:00 – 1:15 h U23 Women/U23 Men 1:15 - 1:30 h Cat. Elite Women (incl. U23)/Elite Men: 1:20 - 1:40 h

XCC races will be limited to 20 minutes.

Category U23:

At the Swiss Championships in **Echallens**, at the **Tamaro Trophy** and in **Basel** there will be an U23 race. There will be no races in the Amateur/Masters category at these events. All athletes born between 2002 and 2005 compete in the U23 category.

C1 Race:

U23 riders with elite qualification start in the Elite Men/Women category, those men without elite qualification in the Amateurs/Masters category. A U23 ranking will be kept and the top three will be honored.

Tech & Feed Zone:

The UCI regulations allow the exchange of equipment in marked zones. Everything except the frame can be changed (e.g. wheels). Meals may only be accepted in the designated zones. Anyone who receives food or material outside of these zones can be disqualified! Reckless behaviour and violations of the rules can be sanctioned by the Race Committee.















Grid

In the Kids and Fun categories, the starting line-ups will be based on the current Cup intermediate ranking, provided they are correctly registered.

The girls are lined up behind the boys, usually the start of the girls is about **one - three** minutes later. In the skill course (Cat. U9/U11), the leaders of the intermediate classification start at the end.

At the first race (season opener), the ten best of last year's CIC ON Swiss Bike Cup overall standings can stand at the front of the fun categories.

In the case of the kids, the ten best per year will be called, after which those who finished at least 1.000 in last year's overall ranking of the CIC ON Swiss Bike Cup will be called. 220 points, then after receipt of registration.

The licensing categories are governed by the regulations of the UCI (Union Cycliste Internationale). See www.uci.org. Riders without UCI points will be called according to the current Swiss Cycling annual ranking (top 20) and then according to the Cup classification.

At the season opener, the riders without UCI points will be lined up according to the registration date, analogous to the Kids and Fun categories.

In the juniors and amateurs/masters, the top ten of the youngest age group will be placed directly after the riders with UCI points.

In the case of a UCI Junior Series, the corresponding regulations apply.


Leader Jerseys


In the Kids and Fun categories, the overall leaders will be dressed in the official CIC On Swiss Bike Cup Leader jersey after each run. This must not be printed.

The licensed riders will also receive a leader's jersey printed with the team logo. The licensed riders are obliged to wear the leader's jersey at further starts at the CIC On Swiss Bike Cup.

If two athletes are tied on points, the leader jersey with the better result of the day will be awarded.





















Overall

The following points are up for grabs in each race:

1st place	100 points	8th place	58

Kids (U9, U11, U15, U17):

In the categories U9, U11, U13, U15, U17, the six best results of the races one seven count for the overall ranking (one **cancellation result possible).**The final will be counted in any case and cannot be chosen as a strike result. Those who do not start at the final will be counted in the overall standings, but will receive a zero for this race. Whoever has the most points from these six competitions is the category winner. In the event of a tie, the better result of the final will be decisive.

At the race in Echallens, the Swiss Champ will be chosen in the U17 category. The race will be counted in the overall standings.

Fun:

In the fun categories, the five **best results of races one - seven count** for the overall ranking (**two cancellation results possible**). The final will be counted in any case and cannot be chosen as a strike result. Those who do not start at the final will be counted in the overall standings, but will receive a zero for this race. Whoever has the most points from these five competitions is the category winner. In the event of a tie, the result of the final will be decisive.

In the Fun Easy Ride category, there is no overall ranking.

















UCI Category License:

In the licence categories, the four best results of races one - six (two cancelled results) count for the overall ranking.

The Swiss Championships XCO and XCC in Echallens will not be counted in the CIC On Swiss Bike Cup overall ranking.

The final will be counted in any case and cannot be chosen as a strike result. Those who do not start at the final will be listed in the overall standings, but will receive a zero for this race.

Whoever has the most points from these four competitions is the category winner. In the event of a tie, the result of the final will be decisive.

For all athletes who compete at the **Tamaro Trophy** and in **Basel** in the U23 category, the results will be counted as cancelled results for the overall ranking of the elite category.

The races of the Tamaro Trophy and Basel will be counted for the overall ranking of the U23 category. (Separate U23 races must now be held at all HC races)

An U23 athlete is listed in the overall ranking of the Elite and U23 or Amateurs/Masters.

In the U23 category, the four best results of races one - six (two cancelled results) count.

Category Amateurs/Masters:

In the Amateur/Master category, the four best results of races one - four count towards the overall ranking.

The following races will feature the Amateurs/Masters category. (Gränichen, Lugano, Leysin and Crans Montana)

The Masters races will be held at all stages. The races of the Tamaro Trophy, Echallens and Basel do not count towards the overall ranking.

















UCI Junior Series

In Basel, Monte Tamaro and Crans-Montana, the junior races will be held as part of the "UCI Junior Series".

The UCI regulations were amended at our request, so that there are no restrictions on participation for juniors from the host country. This means that all Swiss juniors are eligible to start in Basel and Gränichen, regardless of UCI points.

Strike results

The cancelled results will be taken into account after the final race. During the season, no cancellation results are taken into account. The last race of the season cannot be chosen as a cancelled result.

























Final Prizes

On the final day, the overall winners of the CIC On Swiss Bike Cup 2024 will be determined and honoured.

In all categories, the first ten boys/men and girls/women in the overall ranking will receive prizes in kind or vouchers.


The most successful kids of the season will also be invited to an MTB training camp from October 6 – 11, 2024. Those eligible to participate will be provided with all information after the final race. (Start Sunday evening - end Friday afternoon)

Cat. U15	4 boys (2 per year), 4 girls (2 per year)
Cat. U13	4 Boys (2 per year), 4 girls (2 per year)
Cat. U11	2 boys (2 per cat), 2 girls (2 per cat.)
Cat. U9	1 boy (1 per cat.), 1 girl (1 per cat.)

Only children with a permanent residence in Switzerland are eligible to participate. Category winners from abroad are allowed to take part in the camp in addition to the Swiss children. If a child is unable to participate in the final camp, there is no entitlement to a substitute prize. No children will be re-nominated.

Club/Team Ranking

Club ranking for drivers without a licence Team classification for drivers with a licence

Registrations for the team/club classification take place via the registration portal of the CIC On Swiss Bike Cup. The team/club name must be entered identically for all athletes of the same team. Subsequent changes will not be taken into account.

Club Ranking:

A club ranking is held at all races and the winning team is determined and honoured at each race.

The points of the best club driver from the following five category groups are included in the daily ranking:

- Categories Fun (Fun Men, Fun Seniors and Fun Women)
- Categories (U9/U11)
- Category U13
- Category U15
- Category U17

In the event of a tie, the following will be decisive: Points in category: U9, U11, U13, U15, U17, Fun (in that order)

If, for example, riders from the same team reach 8th place in Fun Men, Fun Women 3rd place, as well as 7th place in the U15 boys and U15 girls 10th place, the result of the Fun Woman (3rd place - 70 points) and the U15 boys (7th place - 59 points) will be included in the ranking, etc.


The winning club of the day will receive a winner's trophy.

For the overall ranking of the club ranking, all daily rankings count (no cancelled results). In the event of a tie, the better result of the final race will be decisive.

There is no limit to the number of riders per club. Additional drivers can be registered at any time. Correct registration is required. No points can be taken into account retrospectively.

The winning club of the overall ranking will receive 10m2 of free parking space for all editions for the following season.





















Team:

A team classification will be held at all races. The points of the four best drivers will be included in the day's ranking. The points are included in the ranking with a category factor:

Elite Men	1.00
Women	1.00
Juniors girls	0.70
Juniors boys	0.70
Amateurs/Masters/U23	0.80

At each race, the winning team will be determined and honored. In the event of a tie, the better individual result will be decisive. All daily rankings count for the overall ranking. In the event of a tie, the result of the final race will be decisive.

There is no limit to the number of riders per team.

The winning team of the overall ranking will receive 10m2 of free parking space for all events for the following season.





















Hill Climb presented by PROFFIX

At all stages of the CIC ON Swiss Bike Cup there will be a Hill Climb classification. A marked section of the route in an ascent is marked out and the time is measured. The fastest time of the race counts. The fastest athletes in this special classification will be rewarded with a bonus on the podium after the race.
