# Who we are

Allsorts Youth Project is a Sussex-based charity that listens to, supports & connects children & young people (under 26) who are lesbian, gay, bi, trans or exploring their sexual orientation and/or gender identity (LGBT+)

With a view of seeing a world in which all LGBT+ children & young people are free to thrive, we challenge exclusion, prejudice and discrimination in all areas of their lives, with a three-pronged approach;

### In aid of Allsorts

If you're raising funds to donate to Allsorts and would like to shout about your campaign, event or successes, please make sure it is phrased as "raising funds / fundraising in aid of Allsorts".



# Registered Charity Number

Please reference our Registered Charity Number on any promotional material or event page you make to promote your event. For example, in small writing at the bottom of a poster: "Reg Charity No: 1123014"



# Using Allsorts' Logos

Using our logo on your promotional material can help let people know that Allsorts is aware of the fundraising. If you'd like to use our logos, please get in touch by emailing fundraising@allsortsyouth.org.uk



# Health & Safety

If you're organising an in-person event, please consider health & safety. How accessible and safe is your event venue? If you are providing food, follow hygiene rules when preparing and storing food.



### Insurance

For sporting events, consider insurance. Contact your local authority to find out more about how they can help you.



### Raffles & Lotteries

If you are selling raffle tickets in aid of a charity during an event, you do not need a licence to sell raffle tickets as long as;

- No purchased prizes exceed the value of £250 (however, donated prizes can be of any value)
- All tickets are sold for the same price, on the same day and in the same premises that the raffle is drawn.
- If alcohol is included as a prize, the venue must be licensed. If you are holding a large scale raffle, you may need to obtain a small lotteries licence via your local authority. You can find out more here



## Licenses & Permission

Some fundraising activities, including collecting money in a public place, require licences or permission from local authorities. Find out more about the <u>regulation of specific fundraising methods here</u>.
