

City of Lansing Arts & Culture Grants ARTS IMPACT GRANT Fiscal Year 2024

The Arts Council of Greater Lansing is pleased to announce the City of Lansing's Arts Impact Project. This annual project awards \$75,000 for the development of a permanent art installation that enhances a neighborhood's appearance and sparks community engagement in the City of Lansing. We want your creative ideas!

Turn your creative idea into a brief letter of intent to submit for review by October 13, 2023. Persons interested in sharing a project idea can simply send a letter of intent to Taylor Haslett, at taylor@lansingarts.org or upload a video submission to Youtube or Google Drive. Each submission will be reviewed for eligibility - see eligibility criteria below. If your idea is eligible, you will be invited to submit a full proposal. Each invited applicant is highly encouraged to attend the pre-planned City of Lansing Feasibility Day, an opportunity to sit down with members of the City's departments that are part of the process of installing art, to ask questions about their project ideas and what processes they might encounter with the City. This will greatly help your full proposal and build connection with people that can make your project a success! Final proposals are due on November 22, 2023. The review panel – five arts, cultural and civic leaders selected by Arts Council Greater Lansing – will review the applications using criteria within the guidelines given to all applicants. The proposal with the highest score will be chosen.

Community and Creativity

The Arts Impact Project will place artists/designers and community members at the forefront of project planning so that the chosen project will reflect the creativity, stories and sensibility of the neighborhood in which it resides. Projects may include but are not limited to physical gateways, small outdoor performance spaces, murals, alley enhancements, mosaics, way-finding installations, landscaping/greenspaces and seating, public art representing a neighborhood's heritage and cultures, community-driven collaborative art installations, playground/play-on art, and/or arts incubator/studio spaces to name just a few. (NOTE: The panel is NOT looking for temporary projects or programming ideas -- proposed projects must be built for lasting impact and be permanently installed where people can gather and convene.)

What you need to know

The proposal style has changed! The City of Lansing wants to hear exciting, creative ideas for making our city and communities amazing through art and creativity and will announce the chosen project after December 1, 2023. The guidelines below will assist you in choosing a project and planning your proposal.

Eligibility Criteria

- Must be located in the City of Lansing
- Must be led by an artist/designer/creative (but can be pitched by any entity or individual)
- Must be a permanent, physical art installation
- Must have high visibility in a public place
- Will be given priority if proposed projects are located within 2023 focus areas

NEW Arts Impact Format

Step 1: Letter of Intent

- Send a simple letter by email to Taylor Haslett at taylor@lansingarts.org by October 13, 2023.
 - State your name and affiliation/organization (if applicable)
 - Briefly explain your project, its location and community impact
 - List any partners and organizations that may have helped to envision the project and will help with its planning and implementation
 - o Tell us why you think this project should be chosen

Step 2: Invitation to Apply Sent

Step 3: Attend City of Lansing Feasibility Meeting Day

This is your chance to ask the City any feasibility questions about your proposed project!
 Attending this is highly encouraged, even if your proposed project is not directly on City of Lansing property.

Step 4: Submit Final Proposal by November 22, 2023.

Review Criteria

Budget (4 points possible)

Is the budget complete and individual line items add up to the total budget? 0-2 points Does the project require funds aside from this grant? Are they secured? 0-2 points

Capacity (8 points possible)

Does the applicant's past work illustrate that they can successfully complete

this project? 0-4 points Has the applicant identified their project partners, or do they have a plan to? 0-2 points 0-2 points

Did the applicant attend a meeting with City of Lansing prior to applying?

Impact (14 points possible)

Is the project interactive? Does it have potential to engage the surrounding

community? 0-4 points Is the project located in a City of Lansing area of focus? (Green on map.) 0-4 points Does the project have clear, feasible goals/outcomes in mind? 0-2 points Is the project rooted in place? 0-4 points

Examples of how projects might connect with place: 1) the project involves nearby residents in planning, installation, creation, longevity, etc., 2) the project is led by someone who grew up or lives in the neighborhood, ZIP or City, 3) the project tells the stories of a neighborhood/residents from the people themselves in the ways they want them told.

Longevity (2 points possible)

Is there a plan for or attention to project maintenance and longevity? 0-2 points

Total possible points: 0-28 points
