Discussion questions:

- 1. Do you know someone who has grieved the loss of an unborn child? How did they cope? What can you learn from their experience?
- 2. Before King David's son died, he "sought God on behalf of the child. And David fasted and went in and lay all night on the ground. ¹⁷ And the elders of his house stood beside him, to raise him from the ground, but he would not, nor did he eat food with them." (2 Samuel 12:16-17). Compare that with David's response upon the death of his son in 2 Samuel 122:19-23 (on the next page). What does this passage say about the faith of David?
- 3. Dean mentioned John 3:16 and Romans 8:18-19 (both are on the next page). How might these verses help one coping with loss?
- 4. Dean also referenced Psalm 103 (part of it is on the next page). He specifically referenced verse 8. How does belief in these verses help in times of grief?

They said, "He is dead." ²⁰ Then David arose from the earth and washed and anointed himself and changed his clothes. And he went into the house of the Lord and worshiped. He then went to his own house. And when he asked, they set food before him, and he ate. ²¹ Then his servants said to him, "What is this thing that you have done? You fasted and wept for the child while he was alive; but when the child died, you arose and ate food." ²² He said, "While the child was still alive, I fasted and wept, for I said, 'Who knows whether the Lord will be gracious to me, that the child may live?' ²³ But now he is dead. Why should I fast? Can I bring him back again? I shall go to him, but he will not return to me."
