Thank you for reaching out. Yes, please add \$1,300.00 to cover increased cost of materials. With regards to lead times for the EVBox Business Line Units, we were notified by the manufacturer the lead times from order placement is 10-12 weeks due to COVID stress on the supply chain. That said, we have access to an alternative solution (see attached) if the Town rather move quicker. This unit is approved on the NYSERDA rebate website, and we have US inventory to pull from.

Just a head's up since a lot of time has passed from the initial bid. Rebates and incentives have improved, and it may make financial sense to re-scope the project using these 2021 incentives. If the Town is interested, I can have one of our experts reach out to discuss options. There is a good chance the Town's out of pocket costs can be absorbed up to 100% (or close to it) with rebates and incentives.

The contractor is passing on his increased costs due to the rise in material costs. We are seeing materials increase across the board post COVID as building materials are skyrocketing. My concern is because I was trying to keep this proposal reasonable, there is very little margin, otherwise I'd eat the difference. We've put a lot of time and energy with multiple onsite iterations and bid revisions trying to accommodate the Town. We value its business and the Team.

# **CDBG Public Hearing Requirements**

The Federal Housing and Community Development Act "encourages citizen participation, with particular emphasis on participation by persons of LMI," both in the preparation of CDBG applications and throughout the implementation of local CDBG projects.

- Public hearings should be held at a time and place convenient to the general public, with accommodations for persons with disabilities
- Two (2) public hearings are required:
  - o First hearing must happen between proposal and application (see template)
    - Notice should identify the amount of CDBG funding requested, the program year, and the proposed activities
  - o For those awarded, second hearing must be complete before submission of the request for closeout
- Current guidance allows for virtual hearings
- Must be conducted before a quorum of the legislative body (must be the municipality's official legislative body, <u>not</u> a division of local government)
- Municipality must provide a minimum seven (7) day period between the publication of the hearing notice and the hearing itself. Note that the date of publication is day "zero". See below.




- Hearing notice must be conspicuously posted in one or more public locations at least seventy-two (72) hours prior to
  the actual hearing. This can be a physical posting (e.g. Town hall bulletin board) or on a website. Evidence of posting
  must be attached to the application.
  - o Acceptable evidence of posting: Website screenshot or digital photo with <u>date</u>, written attestation, or other clear evidence documenting the above.
- A copy of the application must be available for public inspection at the municipal office(s).
- Municipalities are strongly encouraged to accept comments from the public <u>at least</u> 48 hours after the date of the hearing.
- The public hearing must also disclose the following information to citizens, which includes, but is not limited to:
  - The amount of CDBG funds expected to be made available for the current fiscal year (including the grant and anticipated Program Income)
  - A listing of the activities to be undertaken with CDBG funds
  - The estimated amount of CDBG funds proposed for activities that benefit LMI National Objective

- The proposed CDBG activities likely to result in displacement and the municipality's antidisplacement and relocation plan required under 24 CFR 570.488
- · The amount of funds awarded
- The types of activities funded
- Progress towards program goals and objectives

# <u>Senior Center – Improvements totaling \$1,725,000</u>

- 1. Passenger Van (\$65,000) A 13 passenger van will allow seniors to be socially distant while attending doctors appointments going to the pharmacy, and the grocery store.
- 2. Mini-Cargo Van (\$35,000) The mini cargo van will allow the nutrition program and Senior Center staff to deliver daily meals directly to seniors.
- 3 Standby Generator (\$50,000) Generator, propane tank, trenching and connections and filling tank Standby power during emergencies, allowing food service to continue even in the event of a power outage.
- 4. Crawl Space Modifications (\$100,000) Excavation and addition of concrete floor, vapor barrier and foam insulation, relocating electrical and waste pipes. Improved air quality for reduced moisture and mold.
- 5. Mold remediation (\$25,000) Remove and replace sheetrock in the basement, to improve the Center's air quality making it safer for Seniors.






