## Public Notice: Drought Contingency Plan (as of 7/13/2023)

The City of Wichita Falls combined lake levels have dropped below 65%, which automatically triggers their mandatory Stage 1 Drought Watch. The City of Burkburnett is a wholesale water customer of the City of Wichita Falls. By contract, the City of Burkburnett is required to trigger our Stage 1 Drought Restrictions. The Stage 1 reduction goal for both Wichita Falls and Burkburnett is 5%.

## City of Burkburnett Stage 1 Response: Voluntary Water Use Restrictions for Reducing Demand 5%.

- Water customers are requested to voluntarily limit the irrigation of landscaped areas to Sundays and Thursdays for customers with a street address ending in an even number (0, 2, 4, 6, or 8) and Saturdays and Wednesdays for water customers with a street address ending in an odd number (1, 3, 5, 7, or 9), and to irrigate landscapes only between the hours of midnight and 10:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m. to midnight on designated watering days.
- Water customers are requested to practice water conservation by checking for leaks, dripping faucets, and running toilets, utilizing water conservation kits such as displacement bags, lowflow shower heads, and leak detector tablets, and minimizing or discontinuing water use for non-essential purposes.
