



1. Explain that you are going to read a story about **Creativity**.
2. Ask learners to listen out for times when the character uses their imagination.
3. Read the story. When imagining the seaside, model actions to go with the story and encourage learners to join in.
4. Discuss the reflection questions on the last page.





Let's Imagine




Hello, I'm Izzy and I love to use my imagination. I just have to think and I can see or be anything I want in my imagination.

Can you use your imagination too?

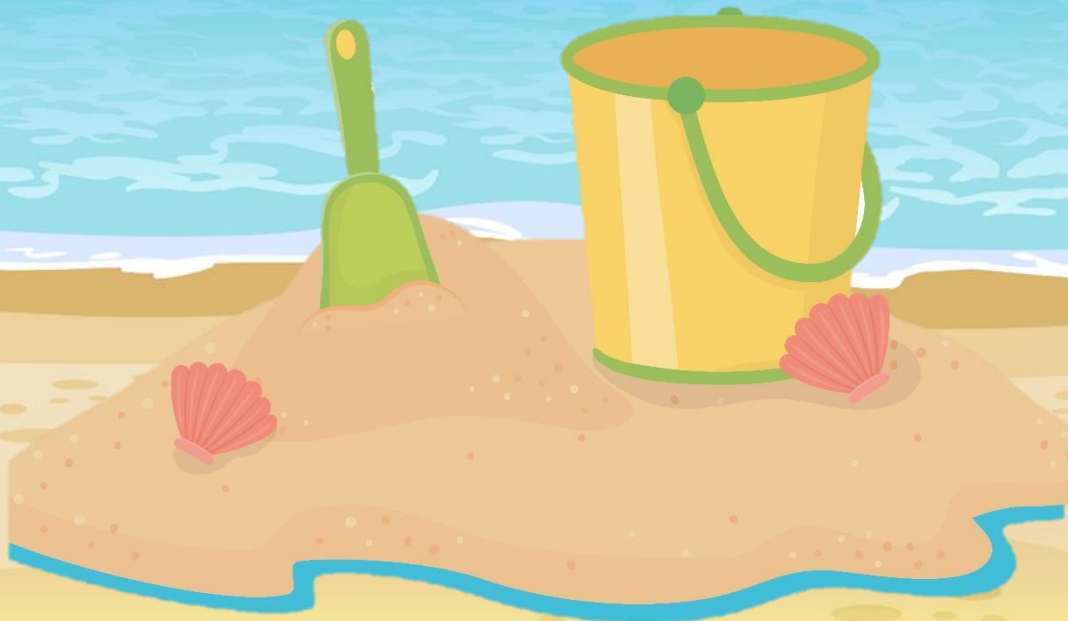
Close your eyes and let's imagine....

.....we are at the seaside. What can you see?

Let's dig, dig, dig the sand and fill the bucket right to the top.

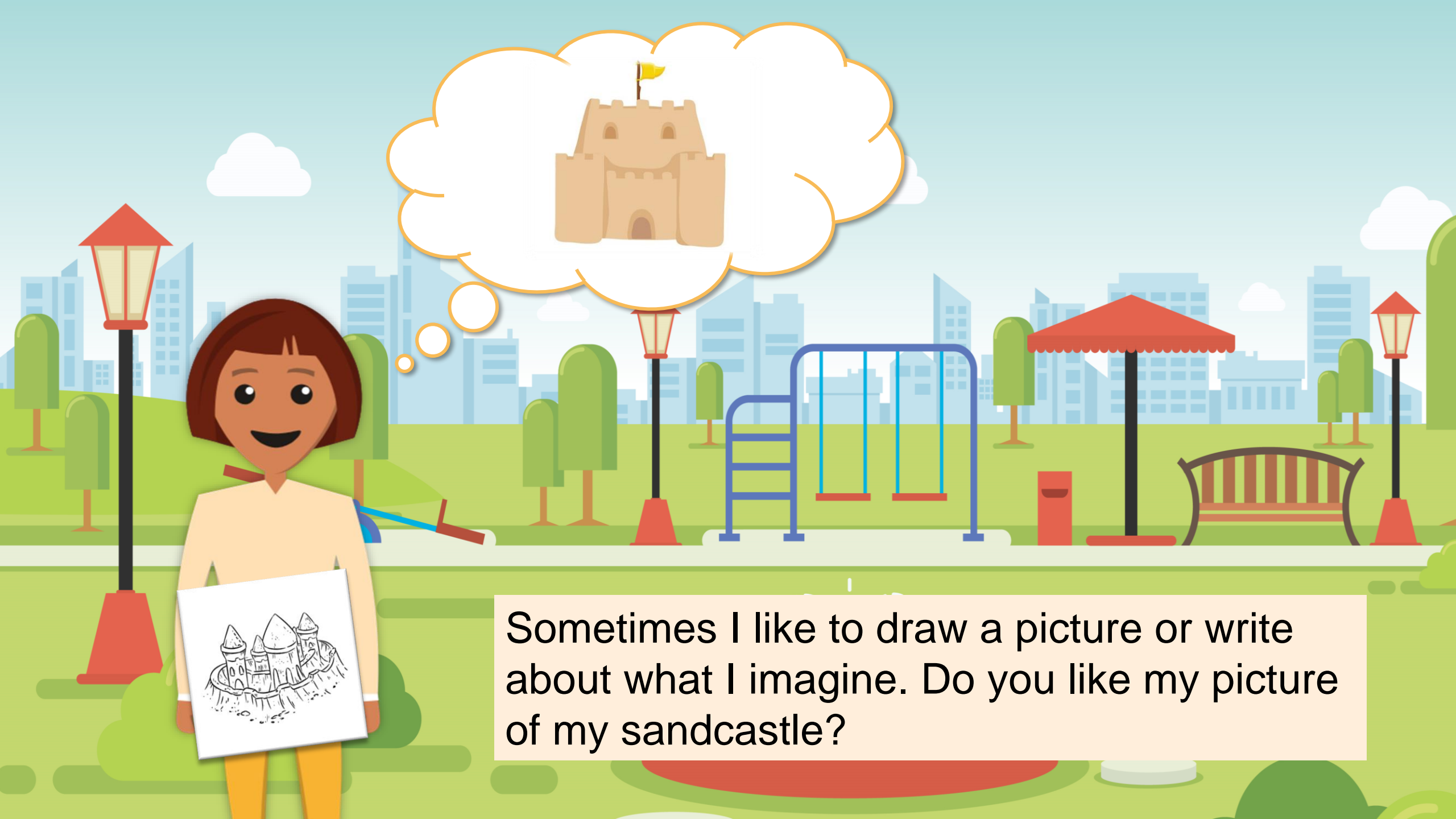
Let's tap, tap, tap the top to make the sand go flat.
