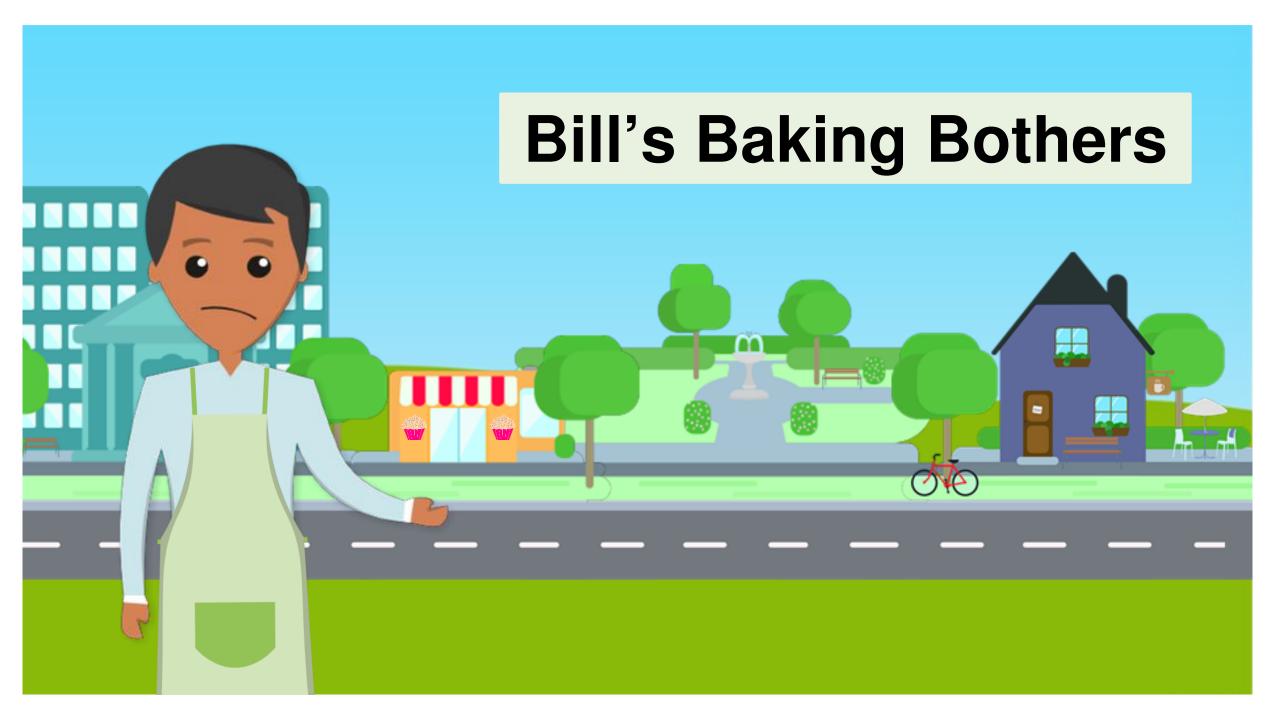




## How to use this resource:

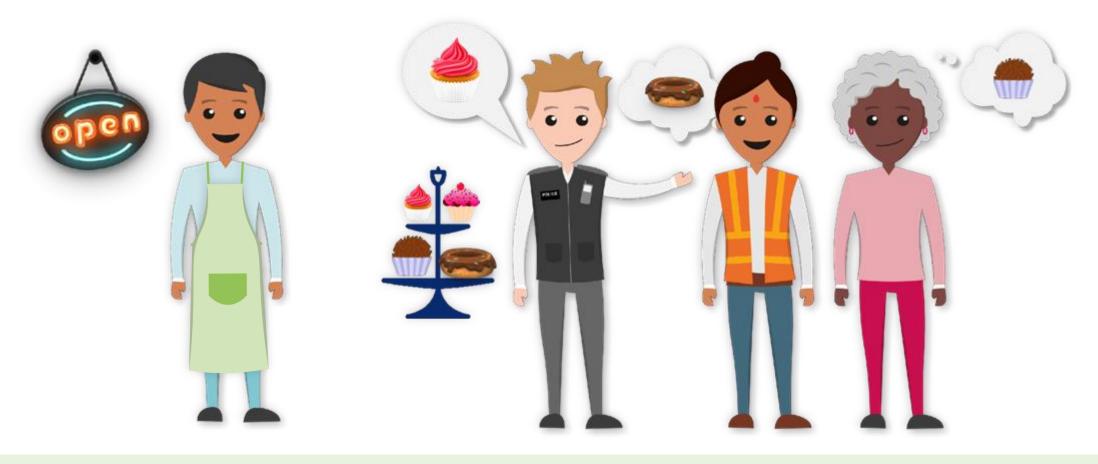
- 1. Explain that you are going to read a story about **Staying Positive**.

1 Dog Cake

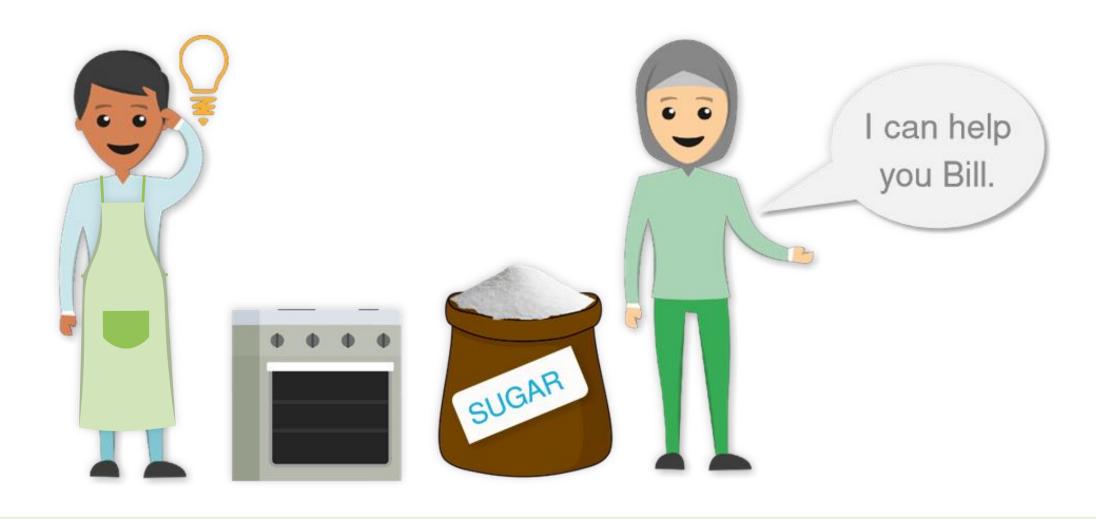
7 Loaves of Bread

2 Birthday Cakes

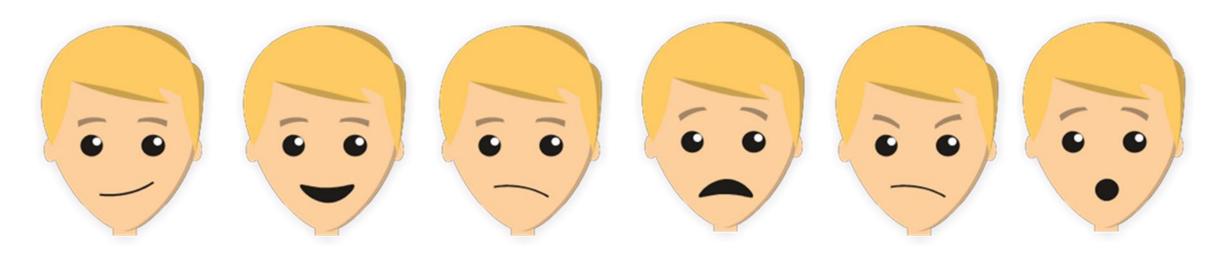
On Monday, Bill began to make twelve vanilla cupcakes. Unfortunately, he had run out of sugar. "Oh no!" said Bill. "What should I do?"

How is Bill feeling now? Is it a positive emotion or a negative emotion?



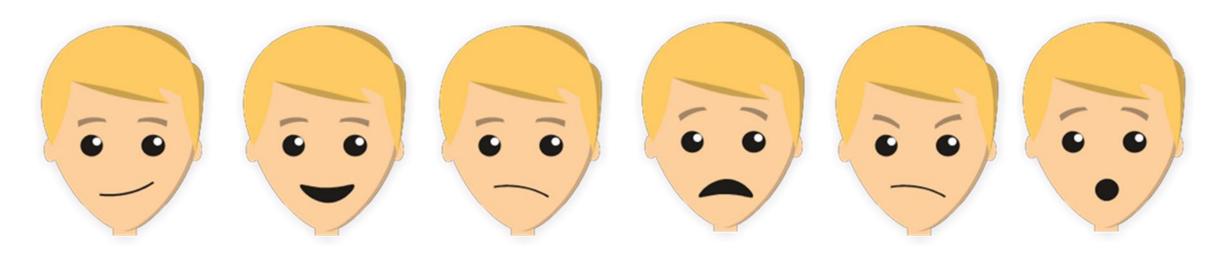

Bill spent two days working on the cake. As he was showing it to his friend Monica, he dropped it on the floor!

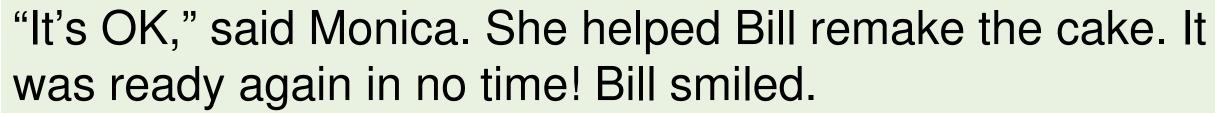


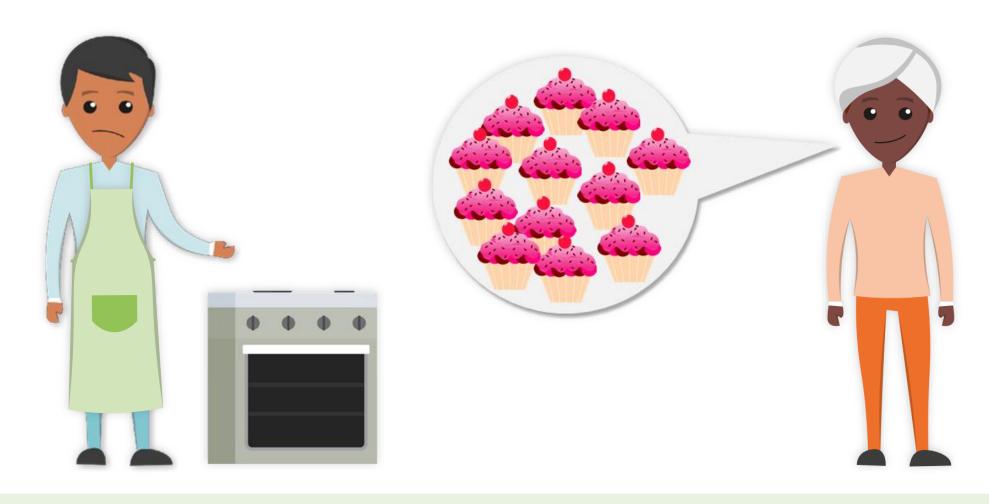




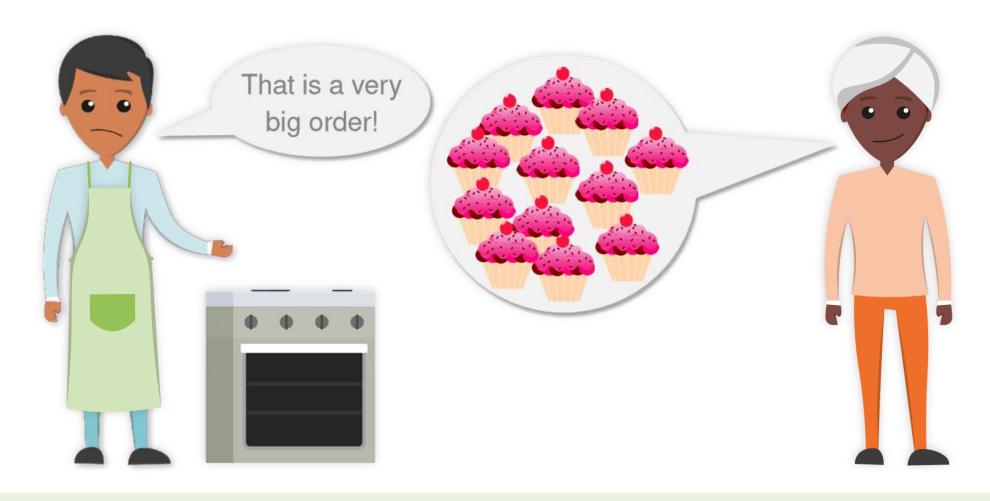

On Wednesday, Nikesh went to Bill's Bakery and ordered one hundred cupcakes for his party.



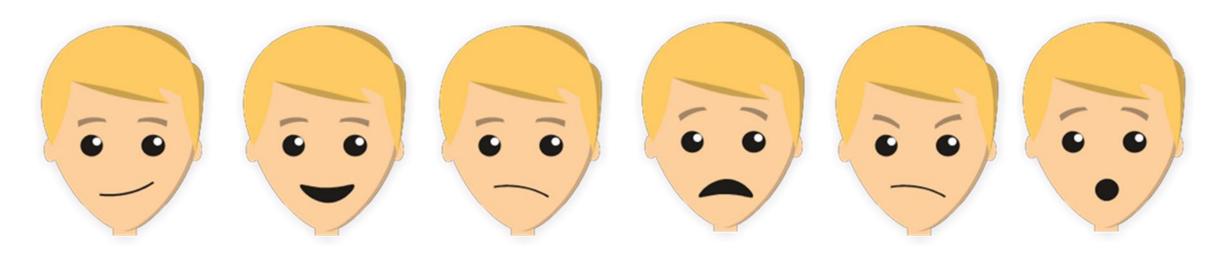
Bill felt worried. He didn't have enough time to make the cakes on his own.



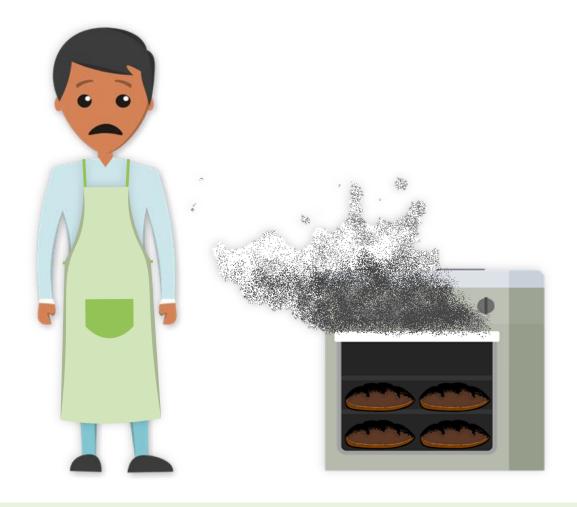
Luckily, his friends were happy to help. Before long, they had made one hundred delicious cupcakes!







How is Bill feeling now? Is it a positive emotion or a negative emotion?

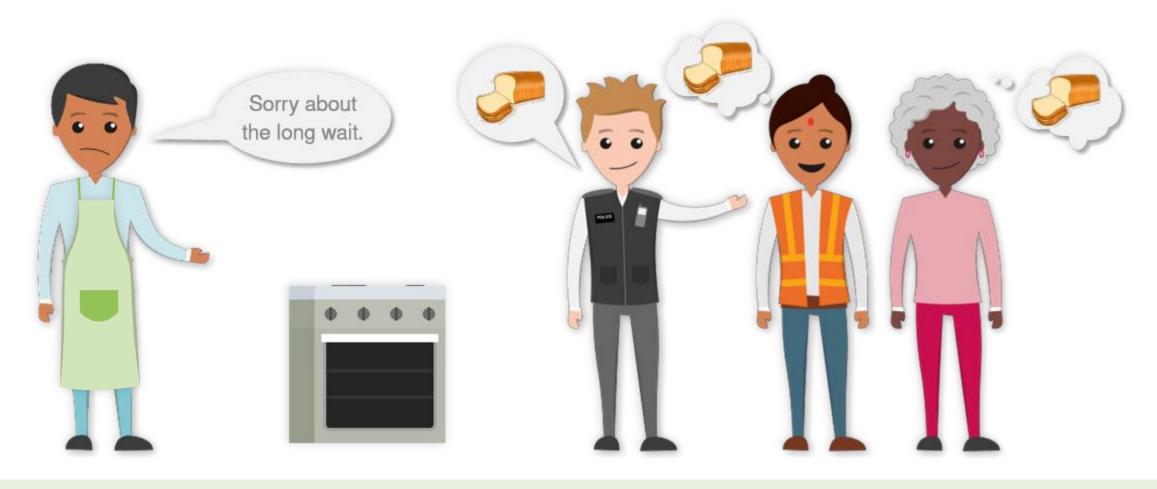


On Thursday, Bill was baking fresh loaves of bread. He was so busy, he forgot to check the bread in the oven and they burned!





Just then, Bill had an idea. He bought a new clock. He checked the time and made sure his next batch of bread loaves were cooked to perfection.



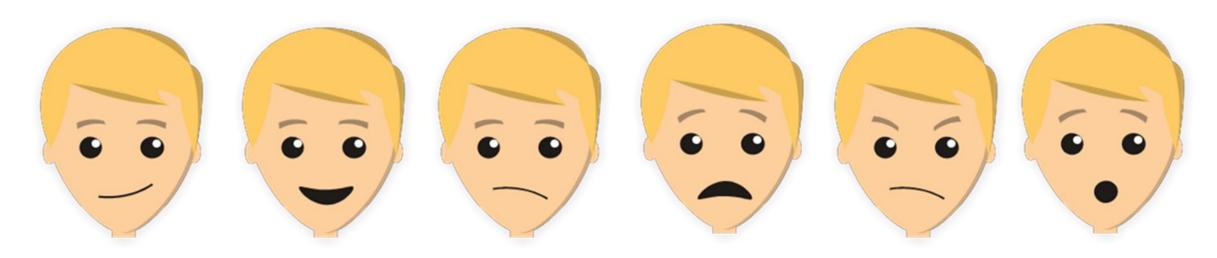
On Friday, Bill's Bakery was very busy. People were buying bread for picnics. There was a big queue. Some people had to wait for a long time.



One customer got angry and shouted at Bill. He felt stressed.



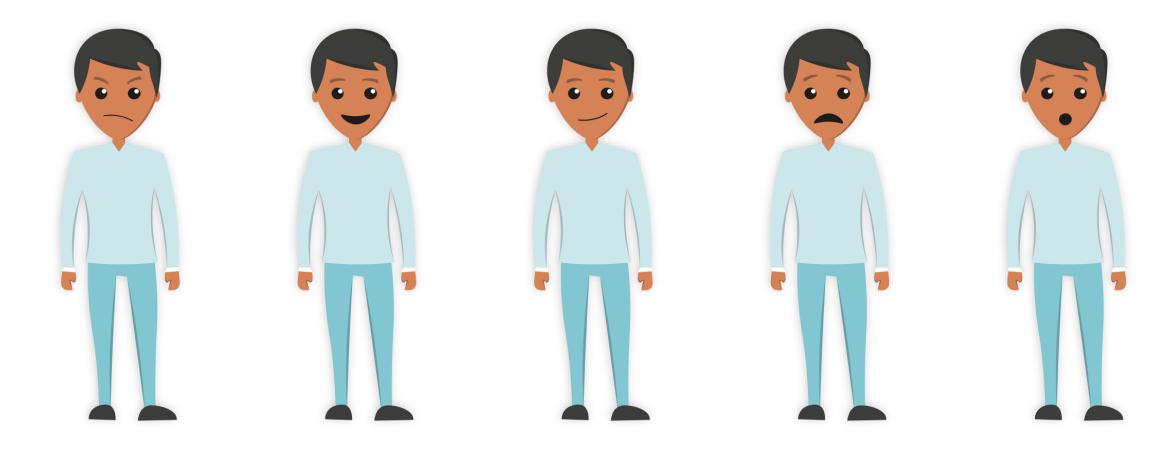




How is Bill feeling now? Is it a positive emotion or a negative emotion?
