







 Mini Apple Pie Making Session: Get your hands on all of the fixings for a Rulfs miniature apple pie and assemble one of your own to take back to the hotel. Bonus points if you're strong willed enough to make it back to your room without taking a bite along the way!

• U-Pick Strawberries, Blueberries and Raspberries (summer): These three delicious fruits are ripe at different times of the summer, but if your group visits in June or July, you're likely to hit one of them! We can tell you from experience, there is nothing better than freshly picked berries. We can also say from experience that more will end up in your mouth than in the basket.







- Pick your Own Apples (fall): If you're in the 2nd largest apple-producing county in the U.S., well you just have to grab a bag and head out to the orchard to pick your own apples!
- Pumpkin Patch (fall): Hop (or lightly step) onto the wagon and take a little ride down to Rulfs' pumpkin patch, where your group can select from a variety of round, oblong, small, large and sometimes "warty" looking pumpkins. Its all about the character!
- Petting Zoo (June-October): Alpacas and goats and a horse...oh my! There's plenty of animals for your group to interact with at their seasonal petting zoo.
