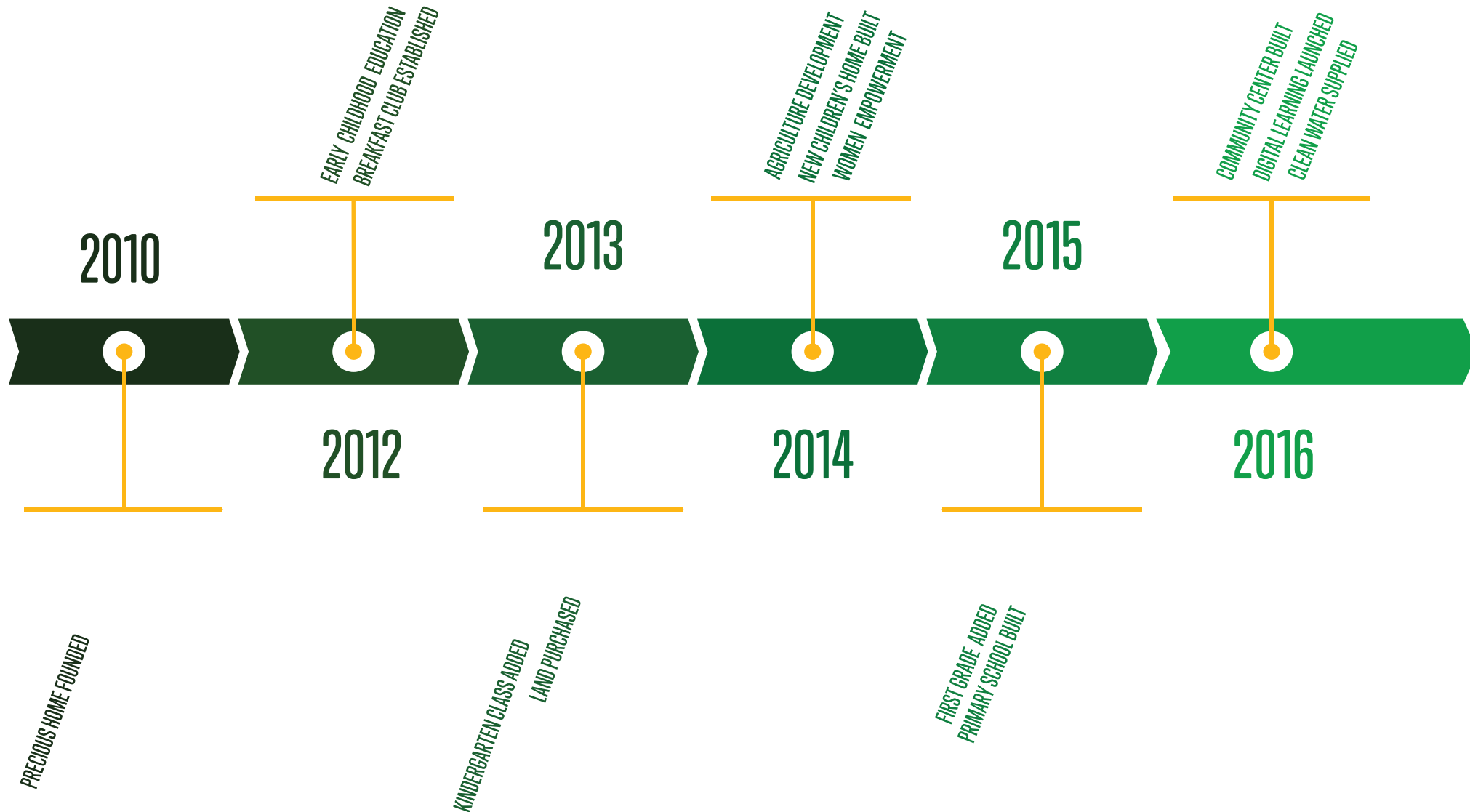


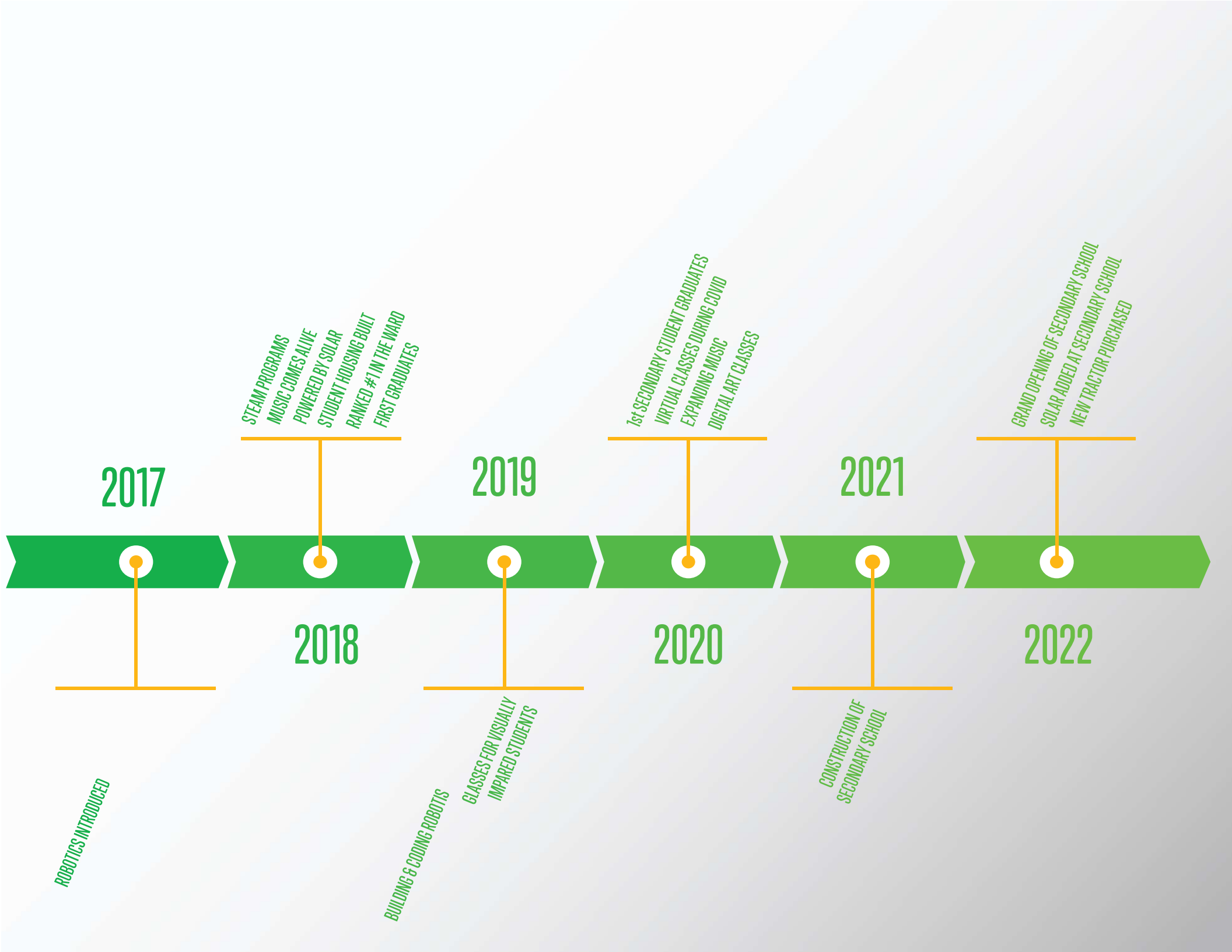

# OUR PRECIOUS TIMELINE

Precious Project has evolved over several phases. Phase one (2010-2012) focused on laying the foundation for quality care of orphans of HIV and an early education and feeding program for village children. The second phase (2013-2014) saw the expansion of these programs to serve more vulnerable children. In Precious Project's third phase (2014) we empowered many residents of the village of Nshupu by eliminating disparities in education, gender inequality, and economic development. Subsequent phases focus on going beyond traditional schools and projects by preparing the students for excellence with superior education.

# & BOARDING STUDENTS

The primary goal of PEMS and PLSS students boarding at Precious TZ is to maintain a stable and safe learning environment where students can focus on their education while helping to overcome the barrier to education that most rural students face. Attending a boarding school plays a key role in helping students graduate from primary and secondary school, by providing them with better access to academic resources and facilities that many public schools do not provide. In the Precious boarding community, students grow closer to one another through daily interactions both inside and outside the classroom (in extracurricular activities such as sports or clubs). We encourage our students to become productive and contributing members of their community while growing as an individual and nurturing positive peer relationships.



**Below is an example of a typical weekday and weekend schedule for our PLSS students:**

**6:00 AM:** WAKE UP, PERSONAL CARE, TEA TIME

**7:50 AM:** CLASS CHECK-IN

**8:00 AM:** CLASSES AND BREAKS

**3:30 PM:** MEET WITH TEACHERS, ATHLETICS, EXTRACURRICULAR, AND EXAM PREP

**5:00 PM:** FREE TIME

**6:00 PM:** DINNER

**6:40 PM:** PRAYER TIME

**7:00 PM:** STUDY PERIOD

**8:30 PM:** FREE TIME

**9:30 PM:** LIGHTS OUT

## **SATURDAYS & SUNDAYS:**

The weekends have their own structure and scheduled activities but with more flexibility. The flexibility allows the students the ability to learn to exercise judgment on finding a good balance between priorities and leisure. Students have time specifically allocated for general chores at the school, dormitories and in the vegetable gardens, library time, team sports, remedial education classes, prayer, and church.

**Precious English Medium School (PEMS)** offers compulsory boarding accommodations for 25% of the students in grades 4 and 7, as they prepare for their National exams, as well as a handful of students that board due to the primary school being a long distance from their family homes.

**Precious Leaders Secondary School (PLSS)** offers boarding accommodations to all students. At the PLSS dorms, we provide a warm, safe, structured environment for our students while engaging them in the educational world where learning is central to all activities.

# PEMS PRECIOUS ENGLISH MEDIUM SCHOOL

**Our primary school provides the highest-quality education for local children from pre-K through 7th grade. We offer free education to the most underprivileged children in the region.**



The Precious English Medium School sets and demands high standards from our students and faculty. Our goal is to improve Tanzania's future through education. When the school opened its doors in 2016, we enrolled 135 students. At the conclusion of December 2022, our enrollment is up to 437 students.

Our approach is based on world organizations' research on what entails quality education, which includes:

- Hiring well-trained teachers.
- Applying positive and nurturing child-centered teaching methods.
- Maintaining small classes to no larger than 30 students.
- Actively engaging student families and the community in service and support to the school.
- Ensuring students are well nourished and ready to participate and learn.
- Providing a healthy, safe, and protective environment.
- Empowering students to become contributing members to society by achieving the highest academic, moral and ethical growth.
- Providing equal access for and promoting the equality of girls and boys.

Our standards for hiring our faculty are high and we continuously review their performance to ensure we maintain the highest educational standards among our teachers. Our use of advanced technology and learning methods, as well as teacher training, sets Precious apart and helps attract talent to our faculty.

# ACADEMICS, ENROLLMENT, & PRIORITIES

Educating over 500 children (437 in primary and 95 in secondary)

## PRIMARY SCHOOL:

At the primary school, 38% (165 of 437) of our students are receiving some form of sponsorship (90 full sponsorship, 55 partial sponsorships, and 20 under barter program)

- *In 2022 PEMS employed 31 teachers and school administrators, as well as 14 support staff (including social worker, guards, dorm matrons/patrons, cooks, cleaners and bus drivers, etc.)*

## SECONDARY SCHOOL:

At the conclusion of 2022, we enrolled 95 students at PLSS. Target goal is to have 160 students at PLSS by the end of 2023, with 50% boys and 50% girls. More than 300 have applied and interviewed. Prospective students must score a 75% or higher on the entrance exam to be considered. 68% (65 of 95) of our students are receiving sponsorship (45 full sponsorship, 10 partial sponsorships, and 10 under barter program).

- *In 2022, PLSS employed 15 teachers and school administrators, as well as 21 support staff (including guards, dorm matron/patron, nurse, cooks, cleaners and bus drivers, etc.)*

# NATIONAL EXAMS

National Examinations Council of Tanzania (NECTA) released the 2022 Primary School Leaving Examination (PSLE) results in late November. The PSLE is a national examination held annually for pupils that have completed grade 7, the end of their primary school education.

We are proud to report that Precious English Medium School (PEMS) is **ranked #1 in the District out of 171 schools, and #7 in the Region out of 273 schools.** It is reported that 37 of the 39 students that sat for the exam scored all 'A's' in each subject area.

This is an incredible accomplishment considering the Precious English Medium Primary School opened its doors only seven years ago, in January 2016. At the time, the primary school was just a two-story building with nine classrooms that educated 135 students from pre-K to 7th grade.

# PRECIOUS LEADERS SECONDARY SCHOOL

The private co-educational boarding school is located in the Arumeru district. Among the key objectives are to educate children who are severely underrepresented in Tanzania's secondary schools, namely the underprivileged and girls.

On January 17, 2022 Co-Founders William and Sarah Modest and Headmaster Telesphory Kafuba were joined by students, faculty, and staff for the official ***grand opening and dedication of the new Precious Leaders High School.***

This is an exciting development for our Precious students, as well as the entire community. When Precious Leaders High School reaches full capacity, it will offer six years of secondary education for up to 600 students. This will ensure that our students are educated with a strong foundation for success.

**One important goal for the school is to serve children from the poorest families as access to quality education is an important contributor to poverty reduction.** Precious plans to support 50% of its student body under full sponsorship, with another 15% receiving partial tuition support. Another significant objective is to recruit and retain girls by providing them with a safe and supportive learning environment. Evidence has shown that one of the most effective ways of reducing early marriage and pregnancy in Tanzania is to provide girls with good secondary education and protection from gender-based violence.

The building of the secondary school is the largest Precious has undertaken. This private co-educational boarding school located in the Arumeru district of Tanzania includes a two-story academic building that houses 16 classrooms, 72 dormitory rooms, a technology lab, a library, and administrative offices. Three science labs and a nurse's office are co-located in an adjacent building. Next to the high school is the largest of the two Precious farms. The farms contribute significantly to helping Precious move toward self-sustainability, nourishing our community, and connecting our students through hands-on learning about agriculture best practices.

"As the school's name suggests, 'Precious Leaders Secondary School' we are confident that one day we will produce committed and hardworking individuals who lead our nation to its promised land." said William Modest.

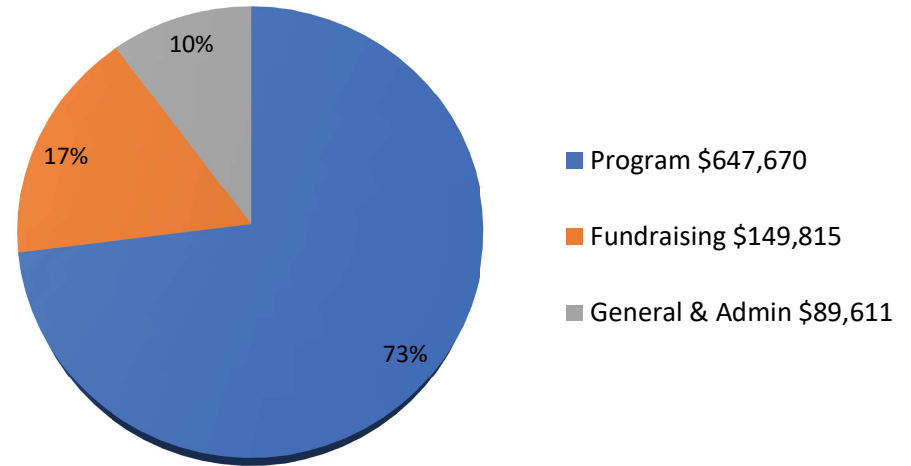
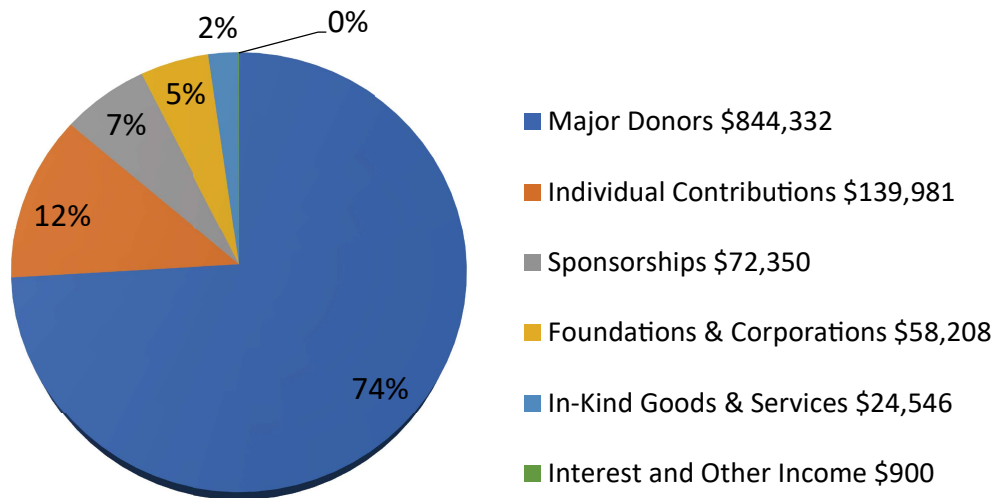

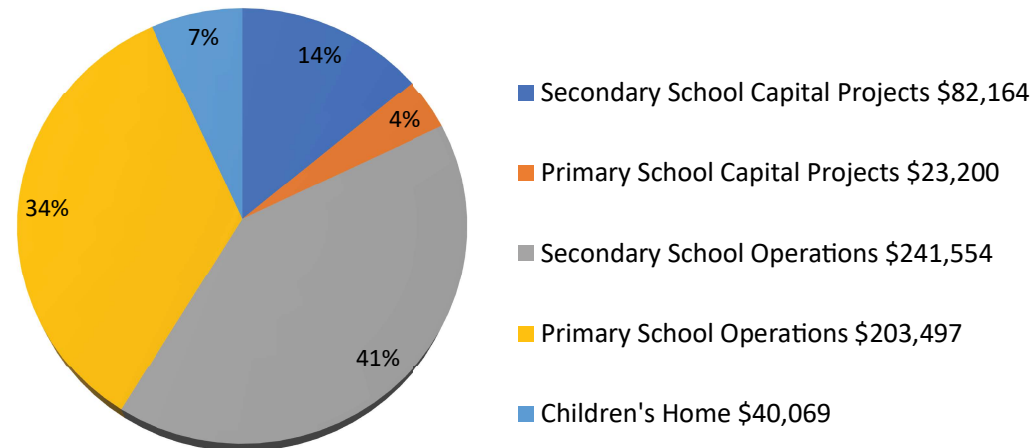
# FINANCIALS AT A GLANCE
