The Executive Director will lead a dedicated team of staff and advisory board members to create a shared vision for the future of Oregon MESA and will champion efforts to dismantle inequitable systems and promote diversity, equity and inclusion. A strong mentor, the ideal candidate is committed to staff engagement and development and fosters a positive atmosphere that enables staff to successfully execute initiatives. Importantly, the Executive Director has a strong sense of humor with the ability to laugh and have fun.

The ideal candidate appreciates STEM and invention education and values the importance of a safe, supportive, fun environment where students can try, fail, and try again. The Executive Director creates a collaborative culture that acknowledges, encourages, and celebrates differences and supports the development of invention skills and entrepreneurship.

- Has strong cultural competence with demonstrated experience engaging diverse audiences.
- Has the ability to clearly express themselves and give and receive constructive feedback, facilitate an open, professional, and collegial atmosphere with staff, advisory board, and community partners.

- Have the experience and patience to work within complex partnerships within a bureaucratic structure.

- Have experience and/or knowledge of invention and entrepreneurship processes.
- Have management experience in positions involving partnerships with school districts, higher education, industry, foundations, community organizations, students, and families.
- Have familiarity with K-12 education policies both locally and nationally and can translate policy into instruction.
