20 October 2023

Enrolment offers are posted.

10 November 2023

Final date for acceptance of offers by parents.

Enrolment Process

To apply for enrolment at the College, visit our website at www. sion.catholic.edu.au and complete the online Application for Enrolment form. Once applications close, you will receive an invitation to attend an enrolment interview with your daughter. The enrolment interview is an important opportunity for us to meet with you and your daughter, and provides an opportunity to further discuss our College community. At the conclusion of the interview, you will be asked to complete a Preference Form, which indicates which Catholic school is the preferred option for your daughter for Year 7.

Our Lady of Sion College adheres to the current enrolment policy and dates set by Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools. We liaise with neighbouring Catholic schools to ensure that students do not receive multiple offers. No student will receive more than one offer from a Catholic secondary school, and you should not receive an offer of a place earlier than the published date. Ultimately, Our Lady of Sion College respects that responsibility for the choice of a secondary education resides with parents and carers, and we will work with families to support them in this discernment process.

Criteria for Enrolment

In processing applications, the priority for entry is as follows:

- Catholic children who are residents of a designated priority parish and have attended a Catholic primary school in one of those parishes.
- 2. Applicants who have sisters at the College.
- 3. Applicants who are daughters of past students.
- 4. Applicants who are relatives of members of the Congregation of the Sisters of Our Lady of Sion.
- 5. Catholic children who are residents of a designated priority parish and have not attended a Catholic school.
- 6. Catholic children from other parishes.
- Children from non-Catholic Eastern churches who have attended a Catholic primary school and are residents of a priority parish.
- 8. Children from non-Catholic Eastern churches who have not attended a Catholic primary school and are residents of a priority parish.
- 9. Other Christian children who have attended a Catholic primary school and are residents of a priority parish.
- 10. Other Christian children who have not attended a Catholic primary school and are residents of a priority parish.
- 11. Children of other faiths who have attended a Catholic primary school and are residents of a priority parish.
- 12. Children of other faiths who have not attended a Catholic primary school and are residents of a priority parish.
- 13. Non-Christian children from other parishes.

Priority Parishes
