Thank you for coming this far and applying!

UNICEF NZ wants to support young people to change their world. Young people have innovative ideas and the ability to motivate their communities to make a difference.

We can support young people to demonstrate leadership within their communities with a grant/koha of between \$500 - \$1,000.

If there is something important to you, your friends and whānau; we want to support you to use creative ways of starting conversations about issues that affect your community.

We will consider all ideas so don't think yours isn't any good!

All you need to do is connect with rangatahi that care about the same things via UNICEF's U-Report online platform.

U-Report is an online platform tool that connects young people to harness their collective views in a way young people can share with decision makers.

We'll encourage and support you to be creative in how you use U-Report to present your project priorities. Who we support will take into account how effectively the following criteria will be met and how the funding will be applied. Alternatively, the funding can be used on a young person's education and work related materials or also their community. This grant is super flexible.

We now have a few questions we would like you to answer and it shouldn't take long. We will do a follow up call to ask more questions about your project. To be eligible for this award you need to:

- 25 or under
- Have an issue you believe you and the people around you would like to talk about.
- Be willing to lead a project in the way you want to have it run

Terms and Conditions

Please read the Terms and Conditions before submitting:

1. The proposals will be judged by a panel of 6 with half of those being UNICEF staff and the rest - young leaders/community leaders.
2. The judge's decision is final - we will endeavor to give feedback to the unsuccessful can depending on the level of responses.
3. The money will be paid into the successful applicant's bank account only, and the applicant is responsible for ensuring the funds are used for the proposed purposes.
4. A brief report on the effectiveness, outcomes and way the koha was spent will be expected 3 months after the end of the project.
5. The U-Report platform cannot be used for intentionally harming anyone else. This includes things such as bullying and hate speech.
