Classic Motorcycle Mecca

From Brough Superior to Burt Munro and John Britten, Classic Motorcycle Mecca has it all. Ride into

yesterday and discover the Southern Hemisphere's leading classic motorcycle collection. Home to more than 300 vintage motorcycles, a visit here is a truly mind-blowing experience for enthusiasts and newbies alike. Housed in two restored historic buildings in the heart of Invercargill, the collection boasts displays of classic British, American, European, and Japanese bikes alongside tributes to motocross and speedway (including legend Ivan Mauger), the collection is also home to the George Begg Bunker. It is an extensive and fascinating insight into Begg's various interests from engineering to competitive motorcycling, philanthropy and of course the cars.

Dig This Invercargill

Ready to leap outside your comfort zone, and get your blood pumping? Dig This Invercargill is New Zealand's only heavy machinery playground and whether you're five or 105, this is grunty fun for everyone. Dig This Invercargill gives visitors the chance to have a go at getting behind the controls and operating their choice of diggers, skid steers, or bulldozers.
