





# Letter from LifeSpring's Executive Director and Board Chair:

The year 2020 will be remembered as one of the most challenging times in recent history. The ravages of COVID-19 included unprecedented numbers of coronavirus cases, hospitalizations, and deaths, not to mention the economic impact, stress, and 'covid fatigue' experienced by all. Through these challenges, the Lord provided Lifespring Community Health with the opportunity to 'stand in the gap' as a beacon of hope for health and preventive care for children and their families in urban Chattanooga.

Through the efforts of a faithful and skilled medical team, LifeSpring participated in a citywide effort to provide COVID-19 community testing while continuing to deliver pediatric healthcare to children. In 2021 we began to administer COVID vaccinations in our community.

In Hamilton County, 22% of children live in poverty. The impact of poverty on their health and wellbeing during this 'COVID' time became even more striking than before this pandemic. We are grateful that in these times, LifeSpring was able to keep its doors open to serve. Of note, 89% of LifeSpring patients struggle with financial security, and 25% of patients seen in 2020 were uninsured.

By God's grace through the generosity of our donors, we provided affordable healthcare for these families in 2020. It has been a privilege to demonstrate the love of Jesus by providing exemplary healthcare and services to combat the devastating impact of COVID-19. We remain grateful for the prayer, volunteer, and financial support of all our donors.

The health disparities that exist in Hamilton County have never been more clearly identified than during the COVID-19 pandemic. A disproportionate number of African American and Hispanic/Latino children and their parents are affected with higher prevalence rates of obesity, physical inactivity, elevated blood pressure, and prediabetes, all of which are linked to an increased risk of COVID-19 infections. These rates are two to three times greater than among Caucasian and higher socioeconomic children.

Therefore, as we move into 2021, increasing the capacity of LifeSpring is imperative to address these health disparities among children of color and those who live in poverty, as well as to serve any family who desires compassionate healthcare for their children.

May God grant you grace and peace as we work together to carry out our mission to share the love of Christ in word and deed.

#### **Get Going**

- Flexible 6-month program in the community

- 22 families participated in 2020

 LifeSpring Asthma Education Program helps eligible patient families to receive education and free hypoallergenic supplies in their homes


- Provided 94 Uber Health rides for families to appointments at LifeSpring & other medical offices (\$2,502 value)
