- of resources and do not give legal advice
- about state and federal policies that impact students' access
- of opportunities for students

BUILD TRUST

- Do not assume or interrogate
- Do not ask to disclose their status
- Do maintain confidentiality
- Identify local organizations that offer support and resources to undocumented students

## Creating Welcoming Spaces for All Students

Visuals are an effective way to show alliance and support. Families will feel seen, supported and welcome







"Thank you for sharing, I know that was difficult to share. I want you to know I will keep this confidential. My role as a \_\_\_\_\_ here is support you and your family through this process."

Reassure parents that their immigration status **will not** impact their children's access to post-education and financial support.

- Provide clarity with the process:
  - College overview
  - College application process
  - Financial assistance application process
- Walk them through the process of FAFSA or TASFA in detail, explaining the requirements and how they should prepare to submit certain documents and meet the requirements.
