CONNECT TO CREATE

To be filmmakers, we have to connect to create. A painter needs a brush, paint, and a canvas. A director needs a writer, a cinematographer, a sound mixer, production designer, editor, actors, distributors, and an audience. We cannot do it alone. This art form forces one to collaborate and thus creates jobs. Filmmaking is unique in the arts in this way. It takes an army. Through our statewide workshops, screenings, labs, podcasts, film festival, and advocacy work we hope to inspire new voices, demystify the process of filmmaking for underserved Arkansans with an interest in film, and create a pipeline to connect them to one another and the film industry at large.

We believe if we provide filmmakers an arena to exhibit their talents and film enthusiasts a healthy diet of quality programming, we can inspire more Arkansans to make and watch more films. FILMLIND

ARKANSAS CINEMA SOCIETY

The Arkansas Cinema Society's FILMLAND is a curated annual celebration of cinema with a mission to nurture and inspire filmmakers in Arkansas by exposing Arkansans to filmmakers and their art. This will be ACS's 4th annual FILMLAND.

Inspired originally by Ebertfest in Champaign, Illinois, FILMLAND hosts acclaimed filmmakers (producers, writers, actors, directors, production designers, cinematographers, etc.) at every screening. With no cross programming (single venue, one screening at a time) and only 5-10 screenings in the program each year, ACS is proud of FILMLAND's unique, intimate, quality-over-quantity program. This year's FILMLAND will feature a 1,300+ seat outdoor screening venue, a digital experience, daytime workshops & panel discussions, and an evening concert series before each film.

As with every year, each screening will be followed by an in-depth Q&A conversation with the filmmakers led by ACS board members Jeff Nichols, Jayme Lemons, and/or Evan Hayes. We hope that by bringing A-list film talent to Arkansas more Arkansans will be inspired to consider a career in film as a tangible and practical reality. Hollywood is changing and is in need of a new generation of diverse, undiscovered, unheard voices. There is so much untapped talent in Arkansas, and ACS is on a mission to find them and give them the tools and connections they need to succeed.

+ DREAMLAND FILM SERIES

A celebration of Black voices in cinema, we screen films made by Black filmmakers with the filmmakers in attendance, followed by Q&As.



+ MIND THE GAP FILM SERIES

Exploring gender equity through film, we hope to inspire our community to have conversations that challenge narrow gender stereotypes and norms.



+ MOVIES IN A PARKING LOT

Community building through movie watching in parking lots! We have hosted movies in a parking lot in SOMA at the The Root Cafe with the help of the Downtown Little Rock Partnership. A fun way to get to know your neighbors and fellow movie buffs!



+ MOVIES ON MAIN STREET

We take the show on the road to build a statewide network of theaters to screen independent films in towns they may not normally screen. In doing this, the ACS hopes to start more conversations about film and to inspire and discover more of the unheard voices in Arkansas outside of the urban centers.

LEARN



+ FILMMAKING LAB FOR TEEN GIRLS

A hands-on, month-long summer filmmaking lab to teach high school girls how to make a film from writing a screenplay to final cut. At the end of the lab, the girls have a finished short film!



+ YOUNG STORYTELLERS

Using one-on-one mentorships between Arkansas filmmakers and students, we inspire young people to discover the power of their voices by teaching them how to write original stories.



+ FILMMAKING WORKSHOPS

Our Filmmaking Workshops provide hands-on education from working filmmakers in the film industry to demystify filmmaking for aspiring film and television visual artists here in Arkansas.



+ YOUTH FILMMAKING LABS

Our Labs, including new Screenwriting Labs, will teach fundamentals of filmmaking to students all around the state, empowering a diverse next generation of documentary and narrative storytellers.

MAKE



+ FILMMAKER TRAVEL STIPEND

Awarded annually at **FILMLAND** to the **Arkansas Filmmaker Audience Award** winner, this provides funds for writers, directors, or producers traveling to competitive festivals outside of Arkansas.



+ ARKANSAS FILMMAKER SPOTLIGHT

The ACS selects an Arkansas filmmaker to curate an event with a screening of one of their films and a screening of a film of their choosing that inspired them to become a filmmaker.



+ HOMEGROWN FILM SERIES

For any feature-length film made in Arkansas or by an Arkansan, ACS hosts an "Arkansas Premiere" for the film and give the profits made from ticket sales to the filmmaker for expenses related to traveling to festivals and seeking distribution for their film.

NEW ARKANSAS FILM & TV TAX CREDIT INCENTIVE

In the 2021 legislative session, ACS spearheaded the effort to modify the current Arkansas film incentive to include a film tax credit, modeling the successful film incentive programs in other Southern states like Georgia and Oklahoma. An easy to use, competitive film incentive program is the first step in growing our filmmaking economy.

Based on the success of the new program, ACS will continue to work with the Arkansas Economic Development Commission, Arkansas Film Commission, Department of Finance and Administration, the state legislature, and the Governor to grow our film incentives to continue attracting new productions and new investment to Arkansas over time. ACS is developing a toolkit for filmmakers in the state to better understand the new tax credit and give them the resources and contacts they need to be able to navigate the new process.



EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS



Arkansas Young Storytellers is an educational program where 10 local filmmakers mentor one-on-one with fifth graders from Jefferson Elementary in Little Rock, Arkansas. This nine-week mentorship program culminates in "The Big Show" which debuted 10 original scripts written by the kid-and-mentor teams, and then performed by local actors.











Every Child Has A Story Worth Telling. Our mission is simple: we inspire young people to discover the power of their voice. Using one-on-one mentorship, public school students learn how to write original stories and see them brought to life. Thanks to volunteer mentors, actors, and classroom teachers, Young Storytellers serve more than 60 public schools in Los Angeles, New York City, San Francisco, Austin, and now ARKANSAS! Reaching thousands of students in elementary, middle, and high school each year.

As a result, young people learn their voice matters.

EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS

Our hands-on summer filmmaking course teaches high school girls how to make a film, from writing a screenplay to final cut. This free lab is held for a month in the summer, and the girls are mentored by professional filmmakers through each stage of the filmmaking process.









The girls begin by developing lookbooks and pitching their individual original story ideas,

focused on women's empowerment and STEAM, to the group. One film is selected and developed into a screenplay. The girls are then divided into pods for each department based on their skills and interests. We shoot the film on a real set with real equipment, hired actors, and professionals in each discipline of filmmaking. The girls get a hands-on opportunity to see their script come to life. Once photography has wrapped, they go into the editing room and cut their film together, working with a composer, sound designer, and colorist to complete the film. The girls walk the red carpet for the premiere of their short film at FILMLAND each fall.

"These girls learned all the different roles, a coed crew might have made that more difficult, with boys leaning toward jobs like grip – maintaining and making rigs for camera support – and girls gravitating to hair and makeup artist jobs or producing. "I'm trying to encourage girls to consider all the possibilities in a non-gendered situation.

Arkansas has developed a talent pool for film and TV,

Tucker says, and these girls can now be included. "There is a thriving film community here. That's part of our mission, to give a venue and a voice to new filmmakers. That's why the girls' short films will be screened at our festival, **FILMLAND**, so they will be in the same room with other Arkansas filmmakers. That's where it all begins."
