- 1. **Read** through the book in one sitting first.
- 2. Then read it again and look for:
 - a. What the LORD says
 - b. Who responds positively to the Lord

3. Jonah

- a. What could you say in appreciation of Jonah?
- b. Why is he angry?

4. The LORD

- a. To whom does God show kindness?
- b. Jonah thought God's action was wrong (4.1). Was it? Why?
- c. Is this is an anti-nationalist story?

5. The Ninevites:

- a. Were they converted?
- b. Why did God show mercy to them?

6. The Story

- a. Who is the story about?
- b. Could Christians feel the way Jonah felt in Chapter 4?
- c. The story seems unfinished. How would you complete it?

7. Us

- a. What do you make of Jesus' references to Jonah (Matthew 12.38-42)?
- b. In what ways is this story relevant to us?

- 2. How does Jesus' comment in Matt 12.38-42, help us understand this passage?
- 3. 1.17 and 2.10 form a fish sandwich. What is the purpose of the fish?

July 28: The Surprise Turning Jonah 3.1-10

- 1. How does Jesus' comment in Luke 11.29-32 help us apply this passage?
- 2. Were the Ninevites converted?
- 3. Why did God relent? (Compare Amos 7.1-9)

- 1. How does Luke 15.11-32 shed light on the book of Jonah?
- 2. Was God's action wrong (4.1)? Why?
- 3. Could Christians feel the way Jonah felt?
