Beyond father and mother

Recently we've had teaching on the human father and mother of Jesus. Recalling this commandment, "Honour your father and your mother, that your days may be long in the land that the Lord your God is giving you." (Ex 20:12), it may seem rather strange Jesus says, "Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me..." (Matt 10:37). He's not denying the importance of parents but insisting everything a father and a mother is meant to represent to a child is embodied in God as the perfect Parent. If "male and female" together make up the "image of God" (Gen 1:2-28), and God is infinite "Spirit" (John 4:24), putting mum and/or dad before the Lord is a case of idolatry. The old saying, "The apple doesn't fall far from the tree." suggests that moral, behavioural, and spiritual family likeness may not always be a good thing. All this calls to mind an earlier Commandment, "You shall not make for yourself a carved image, or any likeness of anything that is in heaven above, or that is in the earth beneath, or that is in the water under the earth. 5 You shall not bow down to them or serve them, for I the Lord your God am a jealous God, visiting the iniquity of the fathers on the children to the third and the fourth generation of those who hate me, 6 but showing steadfast love to thousands of those who love me and keep my commandments." (Ex 20:4-6). Unquestioning conformity to bad family makes a person in a family line subject to divine punishment, unless there's someone in that line who has loved God blamelessly on our behalf. This is Jesus! When the Jews of Jesus' time looked back to the righteousness of Abraham to automatically make them right with God, this incurred the Lord's displeasure, "And do not presume to say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our father,' for I tell you, God is able from these stones to raise up children for Abraham." (Matt 3:9). Only Jesus is directly connected to the likeness of God for us. As "the image of the invisible God" (Col 1:15) we should look always and only to Jesus for all our thoughts, words, and deeds. When we do this, thankfulness to dad and mum can remain, but without sinful conformity and divine displeasure.

AFES - ECU Mt Lawley Campus

The students at Edith Cowan, Mt Lawley, are now into their first semester and AFES and Christian Union are facilitating their planned outreach programs on campus. One of the programs is to follow up all the students they ministered to the previous year, encouraging them to either reconsider a relationship with Jesus or to continue with their faith in Jesus.

A most important outreach on campus is the Kickstart program. This is aimed at connecting with new students and encouraging them to consider Jesus through building relationships and ministering through "seeker" friendly activities. For example, pizza, praise and prayer nights, music concerts, and testimony and question outreach.

The AFES students have told me that although it can be tough being an "out" Christian on a uni campus these days, they are generally well received and listened to. Many of the outreach programs are well attended and there are plenty of opportunities to minister and share Jesus. They put this down to the prayers of supporters such as yourselves.
