The Family of Jesus

Despite enormous technological change in the world, and many alterations as to what constitutes a "family": a married couple, blended households, gay people with a child born via surrogacy etc. the family is as popular as ever. Does such bewildering diversity support or deny the bold claim by a famous evangelist (Luis Bush): "God Created Families to Advance the Gospel". He supports this assertion by reference to a host of scriptures that speak to family life. like passing on the faith to children, (Deut 6:5-7; Josh 24:15), encouragement to be loving husbands and wives (Eph 5:26-26; Tit 2:5) etc. There is little doubt, especially given the background of nation-wide faith in Israel, that for New Testament Christians there was an expectation that following Jesus and growing to be like him began and was nurtured in the home across successive generations. Today the notion of a "holy family" is very rare indeed, once Evangelical homes would house a "family altar" where prayer and Bible reading were practised. Such an idea seems quaint in our day. The only thing powerful enough to revive the family as the central hub of spiritual life is the Gospel. The Gospels make it clear that this was what Jesus message about the centrality of himself was intended to do. The fire he came to cast on the earth would not bring "peace," in the sense of maintaining a cultural status quo, but division on the way to permanent holy peace, setting "father against son and son against father, mother against daughter and daughter against mother, mother-in-law against her daughter-in-law and daughter-in-law against mother-inlaw." (Luke 12:49-53). "Family First" may have been the name of a once popular Christian political party, but it is hardly a gospel-centred truth. The covenant in Christ uniting Father, Son and Holy Spirit as the sole holy and eternal family, and which made the creation of human families possible in and for Jesus (Col 1:16) involves a calling out of individuals from every pre-existing institution to follow Jesus as first and last. Once I used to hear testimonies from young people of how much it cost them to follow Jesus as Lord of their life because other family members felt rejected. Where have all those stories gone. Not merely in a n older congregation, like ours, but any congregation? The first Jesus movement, following Jesus (Mark 3:31-35), saw itself as the one true family. This is a very great miracle we need pray for in our day.

The students at Edith Cowan, Mt Lawley, are now into their first semester and AFES and Christian Union are facilitating their planned outreach programs on campus. One of the programs is to follow up all the students they ministered to the previous year, encouraging them to either reconsider a relationship with Jesus or to continue with their faith in Jesus.

A most important outreach on campus is the Kickstart program. This is aimed at connecting with new students and encouraging them to consider Jesus through building relationships and ministering through "seeker" friendly activities. For example, pizza, praise and prayer nights, music concerts, and testimony and question outreach.
