Friend of God

Whilst only Abraham is directly called "friend of God" in the bible (James 2:23), there are significant other references telling us that the Lord has always had a host of friends. Moses (Ex 33:11), Job (29:4). Jeremiah (3:4) are all examples. It is a serious mistake to separate having God as a friend and having human friends. If Jesus was given friends by his Father (John 15:14-16), and Jesus is God in the flesh, this means that as we follow Jesus, he will give us friends too. Whilst as a child and insecure youth, I oscillated between shy and social phases, since coming to the Lord at 21 he has always provided me with people I can confide in, friends for life. I am not at all saying that all, or even most, of our friends should be Christian (1 Cor 5:9-10), for this would make it impossible for believers to be "the salt of the earth and the light of the world" (Matt 5:13-16). I am saying however that having Jesus in common with another human being creates a bond far bigger than ordinary emotions and interests. A bond in the Christ's blood (Col 1:20) which makes sacrifice for a friend something natural (Rom 5:10). Years ago, I was very moved by hearing an evangelist share that as a skipper he became very friendly with his crew, and was inspired to say to one, "Joe, I can't bear the thought of being in heaven without you." We are probably not natural evangelists. In which case we can listen to what Paul said to the young, lacking in confidence, Timothy, "As for you, always be sober-minded, endure suffering, do the work of an evangelist, fulfill your ministry." (2 Cor 4:5). Has it ever crossed your mind, that the God who "makes everything work out according to his plan" (Eph 1:11), has providentially guided your life so that you might have friends with whom you can share the gospel? If we have never thought about this, we must be living in unbelief concerning the wisdom and power of God. Pray to the Father that through Jesus' Spirit he might create some opportunities where it is truly "natural" to share something about your love for Jesus. It will certainly happen! What sort of a friend neglects sharing with a friend what is most important to us, and best for that other person?

AFES - ECU Mt Lawley Campus

The students at Edith Cowan, Mt Lawley, are now into their first semester and AFES and Christian Union are facilitating their planned outreach programs on campus. One of the programs is to follow up all the students they ministered to the previous year, encouraging them to either reconsider a relationship with Jesus or to continue with their faith in Jesus.

A most important outreach on campus is the Kickstart program. This is aimed at connecting with new students and encouraging them to consider Jesus through building relationships and ministering through "seeker" friendly activities. For example, pizza, praise and prayer nights, music concerts, and testimony and question outreach.

The AFES students have told me that although it can be tough being an "out" Christian on a uni campus these days, they are generally well received and listened to. Many of the outreach programs are well attended and there are plenty of opportunities to minister and share Jesus. They put this down to the prayers of supporters such as yourselves.
