Being Grasped

Works on the Trinity are overwhelming in number, and often difficult to master. This should not surprise us, because strictly speaking, God is never someone who can be examined by us but must reveal himself freely. Thankfully, in Jesus, God who became human for us, our heavenly Father was revealed in the power of the Spirit by various supernatural manifestations. Christ heard the Father speak with his own ears from heaven at his baptism and Transfiguration (Luke 3:22; John 12:28) and saw with his own eyes the Spirit descend upon him in the form of a dove (Luke 3:21). Some might argue that these manifestations of the divine identity to Jesus are unique to the Word becoming flesh (John 1:14), to the Incarnation, in which we cannot share. They come at points when Christ is on his way to death, a call and responsibility unique to his own life and dignity. This is true, but only in a limited way. For God became man so that we might share in all that was shared with him from the Father through the presence and power of the Holy Spirit. Humanity was "taken into God" (Athanasian Creed) in the conception, resurrection, and ascension of Jesus for the sake of our salvation. Paul confidently testifies, that the Day is coming when "I shall know fully, even as I have been fully known." (1 Cor 13:12). That the Lord has known us even before we were born (Jer 1:5; Rom 8:29; Gal 1:15), as well as his intimate understanding of us in the present time (Ex 33:12, 17; Gal 4:9), is a wondrous truth and sure antidote to our weakness of understanding of the divine nature. We can only know God to the degree that he freely chooses to reveal himself to us. This should not drive us to despair, as in atheism, to fatalism, as in Islam, or to introversion, as in Eastern religion, but moves us to pray in Jesus' name that our heavenly Father by the power of the Holy Spirit extend to us an ever-more cross-shaped life. A life of rejection and suffering for Christ's sake will always be accompanied by the joy of the Lord (Matt 5:12 Acts 5:41) and an ever-deeper insight into the nature of Father, Son, and Spirit. This is the path of all who have been baptised into the triune name (Matt 28:19).
