Praying for the Church

One popular scripture for difficult times like today is Psalm 11:3, "if the foundations are destroyed, what can the righteous do?". This was originally penned in the midst of a crisis when the world was being overrun by evil purposes; but the majority of the psalm focusses on the praises of God. When we investigate its equivalent in the New Testament, this must be our emphasis as well. Our ultimate foundation is not that of the material cosmos, beyond human measurement (Prov 8:29; Isa 51:13), but "a foundation...which is Jesus Christ." (1 Cor 3:11). Christ is the reality that is "foreknown before the foundation of the world" (1 Pet 1:19; Rev 13:8). Because in eternity the Father, Son and Spirit planned that the Son would become human, die on the cross and be glorified for our salvation, God confidently created a world despite his full understanding of the coming impact of evil. We see such confidence breaking through as Jesus "sung a hymn" of praise whilst entering into Gethsemane (Mark 14:26), that, despite being beaten unjustly and thrown into the dungeon, "About midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God" (Acts 16:25), and it is why the book of Revelation is the most musical book of the New Testament (4:8; 4:9–11; 5:9–10; 5:12; 5:13; 7:10; 7:11–12; 11:15; 11:16–18; 12:10–12: 15:2–4: 16:5–7: 19:1–4: 19:5: 19:6–8). The consistent gospel message is that "Jesus is Victor.", which explains why genuine persecution is a mark of spiritual success. Despite the increasing difficulties facing Christianity in the Western world, we are not being persecuted but simply seeing the advantages of our privileged status gradually withdrawn. In seeing ourselves as "fellow citizens with the saints and members of the household of God, 20 built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Christ Jesus himself being the cornerstone" (Eph 2:20), we are reminded that it is the gospel that creates the apostle, and not the other way around. It was an encounter with the glorified Jesus that made Paul into the man he became (Gal 1:11-16) and formed the prophethood of John expounded in Revelation. This is one reason why what we sing is as important as what we hear preached. Beyond praying for me, and Donna, don't forget to keep Andrew, Mary, Louise plus Fred and Gray 5 p.m.) and the choir in your prayers.
