Being Apostolic

Are you apostolic? Apart from being a member of The Apostolic Church (or perhaps the distinct New Apostolic denomination), this might refer to several things. You could have a call to be an apostle. Whilst the Twelve, and Paul, were called by Jesus personally, others in the New Testament are called "apostle" because of their missionary labours e.g., Barnabas (Acts 14:14), Andronicus and Junia (Rom 16:7), Silas (1 Thess 1:1; 2:6). Perhaps you see yourself as apostolic because you are part of the Church built on the foundation of the gospel proclaimed by apostles and prophets (Eph 2:20 etc.). You may be apostolic because you join in the apostolic mission to bring the gospel to the nations (Matt 28:18-20). "Apostolic" could refer to your confession of faith in Jesus as Lord which agrees with scripture, creeds, preaching, prayer, evangelism etc. (Luke 6:45; Rom 10: 9 –10; Col 3: 16). The same living Word which indwelled the first apostles and overflowed in their testimony indwells and finds expression in your verbal witness through the powerful Holy Spirit (Luke 6:45; Rom 10: 9 –10; Col 3: 16). Apostolic Christians are Christ-centred believers who gather (Matt 18:20). call upon (Rom 10:13) proclaim (Acts 5:28) and baptise in the name of the Lord Jesus (Acts 2:38). This is not natural, but a sure sign that we are saved people. There is however something distinctive about the apostolic life and character that we neglect at our peril. Whilst some sections of the Anglican Church profess "apostolic succession", that our bishops are in a direct line of authorisation, through the laying on of hands, all the way back to the original apostles, when Paul talks of "the signs of a true apostle" (2 Cor 12:12) this involves a call to suffer with Jesus (John 20:18 -20; Acts 5:18,40; 9:16; 20: 23 etc., 1 Pet 4:1ff, 12ff.) An identification with Jesus involves a bond to his suffering in us (Phil 3:10: Col 1:24). The willingness of the church to suffer for the cause of Christ will be evidence of its faithfulness to the apostolic gospel. This is the message of the whole of the book of Revelation. No one in their right mind chooses to be "apostolic" (2 Cor 5:13), but since Jesus' own household thought he was "out of his mind" (Mark 3:21), this could very well be another mark of being apostolic!
