Reading Daniel as Holy Scripture

Today we are beginning a sermon series on Daniel. Unlike the other major prophets, Isaiah, Jeremiah and Ezekiel, the dating, and so the meaning and authority of Daniel is highly controversial. The vast majority of scholars argue that the detailed historical descriptions outlined in chapter 11, must be aligned with the activities of the Greek king Antiochus IV Epiphanes, who terrorised the Jews in an effort to destroy their faith. Since this tyrant reigned from 175-164 B.C. this demands a date no earlier than around 165 B.C. In other words, the author of Daniel piously pretends the material is prophecy. A conclusion very different from that of a straightforward conservative traditional reading of the book, which pictures a real person called Daniel living and ministering in the days of Nebuchadnezzar and the early Persian kings (605-530 B.C.). The major problem with insisting that Daniel is "pseudonymic", one named after but not written by a real person, is that it undermines one of the great claims of all biblical prophetic writing, what is called predictive prophecy. Was it really possible for Isaiah to receive from the Lord a prophecy in the eighth century B.C. that a future king called Cyrus would be anointed by God to grant to the Israelites liberation from their future captivity in Babylon in 339 B.C. (Isa 44:28; 45:1)? Is it conceivable that the same man could be inspired to pen the detailed descriptions that Christians have always taken to be of the crucifixion of Jesus: "he was pierced for our transgressions; he was crushed for our iniquities etc." (Isa 52:13-53:12)? The answer depends on how one sees God, not just in general terms, but in terms of the revelation that is in Jesus. Christ himself had no hesitation in treating Daniel as a predictive prophecy. When Jesus himself prophesies about the coming destruction of Jerusalem (70 A.D.) here marks, "when you see the abomination of desolation spoken of by the prophet Daniel, standing in the holy place (let the reader understand), 16 then let those who are in Judea flee to the mountains..." (Matt 24:15-16). Jesus' treats Daniel on par with others those he recognised as sacred scripture which spoke of himself e.g., Isaiah (Luke 4:18). Daniel is a book through which God speaks of his own plan and purpose with clarity and authority. Read Daniel as Holy Scripture and you will be blessed.
