Unmerited Patience

"you have been weighed in the balances and found wanting" (Dan 5:27), is justly famous. It is however dangerous to apply this in a way we might think to be fair. We will certainly then apply it to a person or group very different to us, perhaps anti-vaxxers, or abortionists, or Liberal Christians in condemnation. As Donna says occasionally, though, as a sign of the maturing of our marriage, less commonly, "I am thankful you are not God!" I am thankful for this too, because if I were God, I would have consigned myself to damnation long ago. Paul comes to our help in a passage on the death of Jesus by reminding us about, "God's righteousness, because in his divine forbearance he had passed over former sins." (Rom 3:25). If the Lord were to treat us sinners like we deserve, as he did in the case, for instance, of Sodom, Gomorrah, and the Babylonians, we would have perished under his just judgement long ago. Thankfully, "the riches of his kindness and forbearance and patience... is meant to lead you/us to repentance" (Rom 2:4). Peter chimes in, "with the Lord one day is as a thousand years, and a thousand years as one day. 9 The Lord is not slow to fulfill his promise as some count slowness, but is patient toward you, not wishing that any should perish, but that all should reach repentance." (2 Pet 3:8-10). The apostle Paul recounts his own conversion as an example of Christ's "perfect patience" (1 Tim 1:16). As Christians we are exhorted to "be quick to hear, slow to speak, slow to anger" (James 1:19). Which is to say, we are encouraged to be imitators of God himself (Ex 34:6; Num 14:18; Ps 86:15 etc.). Why then are we sharp and snappy with others with whom the Lord is patient? The answer is readily given in scripture; God is a tender-hearted Father who "remembers that we are but dust" (Ps. 103:13) so that he is patient and compassionate towards us. It is easy for us in our self-centredness to forget that between the eyes of the Lord and us his children, lies the crucified fragile man on the cross. As a famous hymn puts it, "Christ behind me, Christ in me, Christ beneath me, Christ above me". With Jesus at the centre of it all, we need never dwell in judgment.

MISSION PROJECT UPDATE Information for your Prayers



CMS – Church Missionary Society

CMS works with churches to set apart long-term workers who share the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ cross-culturally.

A recent CMS Online Missions Conference Dinner, "A World that knows Jesus," provided an opportunity to listen first-hand to the experiences, struggles and victories of CMS missionaries around the world. The keynote speaker, David Williams, asked two questions. What would it take to achieve a "world that knows Jesus," and if we "should keep on sending missionaries"? He continued to answer these questions by exploring the vanity of human planning exposed by the Covid19 pandemic. "If we can't even plan our next holiday, how can we even conceptualise a world that knows Jesus?" How is this possible or imaginable in <u>our</u> time?

Although recent years have seen the exponential advance of technology, it has brought with it social acceleration – cramming more activities into less time. Is it the right "tool, technique or technology that we need for successful missions?" Do we need to be bigger, bolder, and more powerful to get the message across? Not at all. Gospel growth is in danger of falling victim to secular thinking. This is not God's way to deliver the message of the cross," which is foolishness to those who are perishing but to us who are being saved it is the power of God" 1 Corinthians 1:18. Missions belong to God. It is His way to work through ordinary people He has chosen; to work through human weakness imparting this simple message to bring a world to know Jesus in His own time. Yes, we should most definitely continue to send and support missionaries so the world can know Jesus.
