Waking Up to What?

Many of those who sleep in the dust of the earth shall awake.

At funerals there is an increasing belief that the dead are still alive. That the real person (not their body) has continued on somewhere. Perhaps this strange idea has spread at the same time as the focus on our inner selves to the rejection of our bodily nature has spread.

The Bible often uses the euphemism of sleeping to represent death. Death is the ultimate sleep from which one cannot wake unless one is woken by God. And when we are woken - will this be a good thing or not?

Daniel sees an aspect of the future when God will raise many who sleep in the dust of the earth. He is not so much interested in the broader matters of the final resurrection. Rather he is helping us look back over the whole book of Daniel and see that there have been two forces and groups at war all the time. Hostile rulers and others, and the faithful people of God whom they are harming.

Daniel has recorded dramatic showdowns between God's people and the forces of evil. At the end of the book he brings the issues to a terrible climax with what seems to be a great outbreak of opposition against God and against God's people. And although many on both sides of the conflict have died, they will live again.

But this resurrection will not be the end of the story. Some will be raised to everlasting life

and some to the reproach of eternal abhorrence. Death will not be the end for the evil doers. There will be a judgment. What they thought in their pride and arrogance was fame and glory will be seen for eternity as abhorrence and contempt.

God's faithful people will awake to everlasting life. That is, they will share the life of God himself.

Daniel and all of God's faithful people will continue to suffer trouble and opposition. And although "the nations conspire and the peoples plot in vain, the kings of the earth set themselves, and the rulers take counsel together, against the LORD and his anointed, ... He who sits in the heavens laughs; the LORD has them in derision." (Ps 2).

The Christian's funeral anticipates the resurrection to judgment and life or judgment and eternal shame and contempt.

What will you see when you wake up?

Prayer is being offered for believers imprisoned for their faith in Iran. And for those under pressure in Sudan, India, and Nigeria. The Ukrainian crises has prompted funds for refugees across Europe. The government of Tajikistan has announced no new churches will be registered as legitimate places of worship, believers have been killed by air force bombings in Chin state Myanmar, a large Christian family in Vietnam have been forced from their village for refusing to re-convert to animism. The list could be extended indefinitely. Please pray for this ministry and for our persecuted brothers and sisters across the globe.
