Remembrance Sunday

A warm welcome to St Mark's on this Remembrance Sunday.

Remembrance Day – the 11th of November – is the anniversary of Armistice Day, the end of WW1, and has become a day to remember all those who fought and died for our freedom. It is important we say today that we do not want to glorify war, pretend Australian forces have never perpetrated injustices, or minimise the devastating personal, environmental or national evils of war. Yet it is right to take a moment to remember those who fought and died in the pursuit of freedom, justice and peace. Many of the freedoms we enjoy today, were secured by their sacrifices. Lest we forget.

It was said WWI would be 'the war to end all wars.' Sadly we know how wrong that was. Even now our newsfeeds are a constant reminder that we live in a world still marked by war, death, upheaval, and violence. Yet in today's Bible reading from the prophet Isaiah, God promises that one day he would step in to change the present order: "I will create a new heaven and a new earth" (Isaiah 65:17). Unlike our current order, it would be marked by life, security and peace. "They will neither harm nor destroy on all my holy mountain,' says the LORD" (Isaiah 65:25) What good news! That is God's future promise for his people.

And, in the fullness of the Bible's story, we see it is a future made possible and guaranteed by Christ's life, death and resurrection. A number of war memorials are engraved with Jesus' words: "Greater love hath no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends" (John 15:13). And that is precisely what Jesus did for us. Christ laid down his life to defeat sin and death, that all who trust in him may be reconciled to God and share the eternal blessings of life in his 'new creation.'

This Remembrance Sunday, may we 'remember them,' and may we remember God's promise of new creation life through Christ.

"See, I will create new heavens and a new earth. The former things will not be remembered, nor will they come to mind. But be glad and rejoice forever in what I will create." (Isaiah 65:17-18).
