Christ the King

Welcome to St Mark's today.

Do you have enough? In particular, do you have enough to be assured that you are included in God's people, and will stand before God holy and blameless on the day he judges us for our lives? How about if you trust Jesus as your Lord – is that enough? Or is Jesus a *good start*, but not *good enough*?

In the first chapters of Colossians, Paul writes to counter the claim that Jesus isn't enough. The Colossian Christians were being told that to be sure of their standing in God's people and their salvation, sure Jesus was a good start, but they also needed to obey other religious observances and ceremonies (it seems especially obeying parts of the Old Testament Law). And we can sometimes feel like that too. I might have Jesus, but don't I also need more? Be more religious? More knowledgeable? More generous? Even more baptised?! Is Jesus just a *good start*, but not *good enough*?

Paul wants the Colossians to know Jesus is more than enough, he is all-sufficient. And that is because he is all-supreme. Paul writes these famous words, to describe Jesus in the highest terms:

¹⁵The Son is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn over all creation. ¹⁶For in him all things were created: things in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or powers or rulers or authorities; all things have been created through him and for him.

¹⁷He is before all things, and in him all things hold together.

¹⁸And he is the head of the body, the church;

he is the beginning and the firstborn from among the dead, so that in everything he might have the supremacy.

¹⁹For God was pleased to have all his fullness dwell in him,

²⁰and through him to reconcile to himself all things, whether things on earth or things in heaven,

by making peace through his blood, shed on the cross.

Jesus is all-supreme over all of creation, and all-supreme over all of redemption. His blood shed on the cross is sufficient to reconcile all things to God – and so sufficient for you. And me. And everyone who turns to him in faith.

Jesus is all-supreme, and so all-sufficient. No matter how we feel, or what others may say, if we have Jesus, how could we need any more?
