Welcome to St Marks this January

What do you hope 2023 has in store for you? Perhaps you're the kind of person who sets 365 new year resolutions, or the person who hates the thought, but either way we will all have aims, hopes and expectations for the year ahead.

In his letter to the church in Colossae, Paul prays for them something which I think would be one excellent way to be praying for ourselves, and each other, for the year ahead:

⁹... We continually ask God to fill you with the knowledge of his will through all the wisdom and understanding that the Spirit gives, ¹⁰ so that you may live a life worthy of the Lord and please him in every way: bearing fruit in every good work, growing in the knowledge of God, ¹¹ being strengthened with all power according to his glorious might so that you may have great endurance and patience, ¹² and giving joyful thanks to the Father, who has qualified you to share in the inheritance of his holy people in the kingdom of light. ¹³ For he has rescued us from the dominion of darkness and brought us into the kingdom of the Son he loves, ¹⁴ in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins. (Colossians 1:9-14)

Now I'm afraid there's nothing in the prayer about winning the lotto, meeting that person, resolving that issue, or seeing the church grow to a 1000... But there is a prayer for something ultimately even better: that we who have been rescued and forgiven by God, might live a life worthy of the Lord and please him in every way. What a goal to have for our year!

Paul lists four ways in which we may do that, and they are worth our prayer and reflection:

- (1) Are there specific areas of holiness, or relationships, or ministries, in which I could "bear fruit in every good work"?
- (2) Are there ways I can seek to "grow in the knowledge of God"?
- (3) How will I receive from the Lord strength and encouragement, that I may "have great endurance and patience" in my Christian faith and conduct?
- (4) How might I, in ways private or public, "give joyful thanks to the Father"?

Imagine if we get to the end of 2023, and by God's Spirit have lived a life even just a little more pleasing to the Lord in those ways – now wouldn't that be a great year?

MISSION PROJECT UPDATE Information for your Prayers

Jesus Ministries (JM) Myanmar, Latest Report

Half the population are living below the poverty line. Military takeover, Covid, food price increase and limited availability mean 14 million people need humanitarian help. There are 605,000 internally displaced persons. The country's health care system and economy have collapsed multiplying psychosocial distress. Of the 10 centres overseen by JM one has been destroyed by military action and two others are unusable because of regional military conflict. The Powerful Youth drug rehab remains in use and under construction in peaceful far north Nagaland, and the Tachilate Child Care/Youth Development Centre continues to care and educate 60 students, many are refugees. Myanmar Youth Development Centre Yangon is operating with 16 students. Galilee, the mother church (Yangon) continues to attract people for prayer, teaching and food relief. Local costs are low, but the overall budget is considerable. Ps/brother Moses sends thanks to St Mark's for your generous assistance.

One of the mission groups St Marks supports is SU Australia, a Christian not-for-profit organisation that works alongside local churches of all denominations and community groups towards a common vision: to see children, young people and their families discovering life in God's big story.

Jesus gives hope and purpose to life, and on SU Holiday Camps young people are changed as they find out why. The primary- and secondary-aged camps combine the fun and adventure of activities like camping, performing arts, kayaking and sport, with an experience of community living and a chance to see and hear what Christianity is all about.

This summer there are 15 camps running in WA. One of these is Glen Echo 1 which Andrew Appleby will be attending as a leader. The camp is held on a farm in Albany where 30 teenagers will experience the thrill of a night paddle on the Kalgan River, conquer Bluff Knoll (the highest mountain in the south west of WA) and swim in the crystal clear waters of Albany's most amazing beaches, while hanging out with new friends.

Please pray the campers will experience the transformational love of God as they experience a safe loving community and hear about Jesus. Please pray for wisdom and energy for the leaders, including Andrew, who will be quartermaster, responsible for the smooth running of campsite logistics, kitchen duty teams, ablution hygiene and supplies shopping, ably assisted by his kids Matthew and Tahlia who are now experts in making toast for 50 every morning!
