Who Will We Love?

Brothers and sisters,

Who will we love?

As our readings take us through Jesus' famous Sermon on the Mount, we have seen Jesus call his disciples to a new, counter-cultural way of life. As those who by his grace have the true blessing of being included in God's eternal kingdom, they are not to settle for a shallow 'tick-box' righteousness, but to pursue a righteousness which reflects the very character of God. Our reading today calls us to reflect God's love.

If we're honest, so often our 'love' is dependent on how others love us. 'If you show me love and acceptance and kindness, I'll try do the same to you; but if you don't, well you don't deserve mine!' But Jesus radically calls his disciples to love *not* just to those who are like us or love us, but all, even our enemies: "do not resist an *evil* person" (Mt 5:39), "love your *enemies* and pray for those who *persecute* you" (5:44).

Why? Because that is what God is like: "that you may be children of your Father in Heaven". For the good news of God's love revealed in the Bible is that God does not love those who deserve his love, but those who don't. As Jesus says, "He causes his sun to rise on the evil and the good, and sends rain on the righteous and unrighteous." (Mt 5:45). God loves and shows kindness and generosity not just to the 'good', but even to the evil. And that love has been expressed in the highest degree in Christ laying down his life not for the 'good', but the evil. "This is how God demonstrated his love for us, while we were sinners, Christ died for us... while we were God's enemies we were reconciled to him through the death of his Son" (Rom 5:8,10).

Will we merely love those who are like us or love us? Loving all, even our enemies, will of course not be easy. But it will reflect the love we ourselves have received from God. So, who will we love?

CMS – Church Missionary Society

The Church Missionary Society's vision is a World that Knows Jesus.

CMS missionaries work hard to learn native languages and cultures. However, is this necessary? Absolutely, as although 20% of the world's population speaks English, for most people it is a second or "other" language.

People that missionaries work with say: "When I speak to you in English, I feel like I'm at school. When I speak to you in Maltese, I feel like I'm at home".

Because God is a **speaking God** who spoke to people directly and through His prophets, he wants us to speak and to speak the "heart" language of the people.

"My word that goes out from my mouth, it will not return to me empty, but will accomplish what I desire and achieve the purpose for which I sent it" (Isaiah 55: 10-11)

Speaking the gospel really matters and speaking is the means that God uses to grow His church. A culturally appropriate understanding of and coming to grips with Bible concepts such as "righteous", "worship, "fellowship", and "justification" and being able to explain them in culturally appropriate terms to your audience takes a skilful learner who is able to think "outside the box". Research has shown that studying foreign languages produces lateral thinkers.

CMS believes that learning the local language is critical to allow people to hear and understand. Also reading the Bible in their own mother tongue is of paramount importance so that people all over the world may see that "God speaks our language".
