Playing for an Audience of One

Welcome today, the first Sunday of Lent. Lent is often marked, in part, through 'fasting;' we might discuss 'what are you giving up for Lent?,' and even post it on social media! Which makes Jesus' words today in Matthew 6 particularly fitting. "Be careful not to practice your righteousness in front of others to be seen by them. If you do, you will have no reward from your Father in heaven" (Matthew 6:1).

Jesus applies this principle to three key acts of religious devotion: giving, praying and fasting. And each time he warns against doing them merely to be seen by others: like someone who draws attention to their giving with trumpets; or who purposefully prays in public places; or who disfigures their face to show they are fasting! The problem is not doing these good acts – but how they are done, stemming from why they are done: merely to gain the approval of others. When we do that, actions which are intended to express love for God and for others, in reality are merely actions which love myself.

Jesus' words are surely very pertinent for us today too. We can come to church, or say 'I'm praying for you,' or slip into conversation how much we've 'sacrificed', or serve in a ministry, or a myriad other things – but in fact be merely seeking the approval of others. Jesus warns when we do that, then the praise of people in this life is all the reward we will get.

Jesus' solution isn't to cease doing these things all together, but to do them "in secret". When we do, others may not see or praise us; but there is always one person who does: "Then your Father, who sees what is done in secret, will reward you" (Mt 6:4). What a wonderful encouragement: God sees, and knows, and one day he will give the approval that ultimately matters: "well done good and faithful servant, come and share your master's happiness" (cf Mt 25:21).

The truth is, we are all prone to this kind of religious hypocrisy, doing things more for the approval of others. Praise God for Jesus, who alone lived a life completely devoted to the approval of God, and who gave himself to the rejection of others – even to the cross – that by grace we might not receive the rejection, but the approval, of God.

Now the question for us his disciples is: are we being motivated just by a desire for the approval of others? Or will we follow Christ's example and play for an audience of One?

Recently Barnabas has been supplying aid to Christians displaced by Jihadi attacks in Cameroon, assisting impoverished believers in Lebanon, funding repairs for a Christian hospital in Pakistan and supplying food to Middle Eastern refugees in Jordan.

Aid keeps arriving in Ukraine, whilst relevant skills are provided for grassroots church leaders in South Sudan. Flooding in West Africa and internal displacement in Myanmar continues to terrorise multitudes. Food is being sent to drought affected Namibia, whilst ISIS attacks in Congo target believers.

Anti-conversion legislation is spreading across India despite supposed constitutional religious liberties. The list could be extended indefinitely, such as troubles in Mozambique, Iran, Central Asia, Nigeria, Burkina Faso, Algeria... Please pray for this ministry and for our persecuted brothers and sisters across the globe in their ever acute needs.
