Dear brothers and sisters,

Muhammad Ali, the great African American boxer, famously said "I am the greatest". Now we may or may not be quite as self-confident as he was! But I guess in life and work and relationships, most of us would prefer to have the positions of honour and influence. And so, we can relate to the disciples' question, when they come up to Jesus and ask, "Who is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven" (Matt 18:1). Hey, which of us is or will be the greatest?

Jesus gives a revolutionary answer. "Truly I tell you, unless you change and become like little children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven. Therefore, whoever takes the lowly position of this child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven" (Matt 18:3-4). In that culture, children were society's *nobodies*, as low as you could go in the social pecking order. And Jesus says that little child is his picture of 'greatness'. In God's kingdom, the 'great' are the lowly. I think that's because in God's kingdom what is important is genuine love and service. And so, the 'greatest', is one who takes on a low position to serve others. As Jesus did for us, lowering himself even to death on a cross, for our salvation. In God's kingdom, the 'great' are the lowly.

This has implications for our own salvation: Jesus warns if we aren't willing to humble ourselves, and take on a lowly position, we won't enter the kingdom ourselves (v.3). And it has huge implications for how we treat others. Jesus goes on to draw out at least three implications for communal church life. It really matters how we treat all, even the 'low' (v.5); it really matters if we cause any other person to stumble (v.6-7); and it really matters that we seek to restore others whose salvation is so precious to God (v.12-20).

Here are some questions we might want to ponder and chat about this week:

- What might it look like for us to "take the lowly position" to follow Jesus?
- How well do we welcome and care for the 'lowly' in the church?
- How concerned are we about whether we cause any other to stumble into sin?
- Do we love wandering Christians enough to seek to correct and restore them?
- And: How do we see each of these things lived out in the life of Jesus?

St Mark's supports TEARFUND, a legacy left us by our dear sister, the late Prof. Denese Playford.

TEARFUND is working in hard places and currently in six of the top 11 most difficult place to be a Christian in the world. Here poverty, injustice, conflict, and persecution (sometimes all at the same time) are part of daily life making services, resources and opportunities difficult to reach. TEARFUND supports local Christian organizations on the ground and engages in holistic ministry to address the physical and spiritual needs of the people. Conversations are channelled through difficulties to find hope and celebrate restoration even in small achievements. TEARFUND reflects Jesus' ministry of reaching out to these hard places, so they become assessable and visible.

Our gifts to TEARFUND assist the work of partnered NGO agencies in these hard places to supply:

- Clean water sanitation, nutrition & healthcare in **Somalia**
- Training in climate-resilient farming in South Sudan & Ethiopia
- Food, hygiene kits & blankets in Afghanistan
- Safe water points in **Yemen**
- Vocational training & livelihood opportunities in Myanmar
- Certificate II in Faith & Family Wellbeing course for First Peoples of Australia in the **Northern Territory**
