Dear brothers and sisters,

Forgiveness. It's something most of us would like from others — other people, or God himself. But also, something which we often struggle to give. Forgiveness doesn't mean excusing or enabling ongoing harm and sin, but it does mean giving up our 'right' to payment or punishment and aiming for reconciliation. And if we are deeply hurt by someone even once, truly forgiving is understandably one of the most difficult things imaginable. Perhaps we feel, I've given that person enough chances already. Or that they should suffer like I suffer. Or that they don't deserve to be forgiven.

In our Gospel reading today, Matthew 18:21-35, Peter asks Jesus "how many times shall I forgive my brother or sister who sins against me? Up to seven times?" It's actually a very generous offer. But Jesus' response is astounding: "not seven times, but seventy-seven times" – i.e., without limit! And Jesus tells a parable to illustrate both the motive and necessity of ongoing forgiveness for his followers. There's a servant who owes the king *zillions* of dollars and can't pay it back. But in his great compassion the king forgives the whole amount. In the story, that stands for God's wonderful, complete, costly forgiveness of the sins of any person who turns to Jesus. But then something happens: that servant refuses to forgive the comparably tiny debt owed him by another servant. When the king finds out, he is outraged and has the servant punished, asking "Shouldn't you have had mercy on your fellow servant just as I had on you?" The problem is the inconsistency: the man wanted to receive mercy but would not give mercy. And Jesus brings this home for his disciples: "This is how my heavenly Father will treat each of you unless you forgive your brother or sister from your heart."

In our families, marriages, friendships, or church relationships, this side of Heaven we will be sinned against. Forgiveness is costly to us and never easy. But it is the way of a Christian to others because it is first the way of God to us. Christ died to pay the debt of our sins, so that we may be freely and completely forgiven. If we like to be members of God's kingdom of forgiveness, will we extend forgiveness to others? Will we have mercy, just as God has so abundantly had mercy on us?

Here poverty, injustice, conflict, and persecution (sometimes all at the same time) are part of daily life making services, resources and opportunities difficult to reach. TEARFUND supports local Christian organizations on the ground and engages in holistic ministry to address the physical and spiritual needs of the people. Conversations are channelled through difficulties to find hope and celebrate restoration even in small achievements. TEARFUND reflects Jesus' ministry of reaching out to these hard places, so they become assessable and visible.

- Clean water sanitation, nutrition & healthcare in **Somalia**
