Jesus' Voice: Yes and No

When I opened my computer this morning, I found a notice from Midland Anglican parish for a meditation and listening session accompanied by a big YES. Then there was an email from a Christian in NSW just as plainly stating NO. This took my mind back to the time of the same-sex marriage postal vote when certain believers were convinced that the Lord had told them the proposal would fail.

Clearly, the Church today is bound up by various political ideologies of the right or left whose unexamined assumptions determine our voting. Contrast this with the teaching of the New Testament, Jesus said, "Let what you say be simply 'Yes' or 'No'; anything more than this comes from the evil one". (Matt 5:37). In other words, it's not so much what you vote but whether you have consulted the Lord about it. (Much like the lack of Spirit-inspired declarations to do with vaccinations for COVID.) Paul adamantly declares, "Do I make my plans according to the flesh, ready to say "Yes, yes" and "No, no" at the same time? 18 As surely as God is faithful, our word to you has not been Yes and No." (2 Cor 1:17-18).

We are warned about "double mindedness" as a state displeasing our Father (James 1:8), for it cannot be that Jesus is indecisive or unclear; "Christ cannot be divided into different groups! (1 Cor 1:13). James testifies, "But above all, my brothers, do not swear, either by heaven or by earth or by any other oath, but let your "yes" be yes and your "no" be no, so that you may not fall under condemnation." (James 5:12). Self-confident certitude may force us into actions which do not bring glory to God. Have you considered that 63 percent of Indigenous people identify as Christian whilst only 3 percent of the rest of us are regular church-goers? This must count for something. A close Christian friend, Margaret Jacobs, whose Indigenous family are quite famous nationally (https://www.abc.net.au/religion/coming-up-on-compass-cometogether/102487820) was asked on camera what she would be voting. She explained she was still seeking the Lord for direction, but firmly believed that when she came to cast her ballot she would know for sure. This is not a political or ideological statement, but one of careful trust in the Lord.

TEARFUND is working in hard places and currently in six of the top 11 most difficult place to be a Christian in the world. Here poverty, injustice, conflict, and persecution (sometimes all at the same time) are part of daily life making services, resources and opportunities difficult to reach. TEARFUND supports local Christian organizations on the ground and engages in holistic ministry to address the physical and spiritual needs of the people. Conversations are channelled through difficulties to find hope and celebrate restoration even in small achievements. TEARFUND reflects Jesus' ministry of reaching out to these hard places, so they become assessable and visible.

Our gifts to TEARFUND assist the work of partnered NGO agencies in these hard places to supply:

- Clean water sanitation, nutrition & healthcare in **Somalia**
- Training in climate-resilient farming in South Sudan & Ethiopia
- Food, hygiene kits & blankets in Afghanistan

- Vocational training & livelihood opportunities in **Myanmar**
