Dear brothers and sisters,

Imagine someone is at work and their boss goes away – what do they do? Work diligently? Or maybe this is the time to check social media, have that long hair appointment, take an all-afternoon lunch... It's tempting isn't it?!

This advent we are looking at Jesus' parables in Matthew 25, and they're all about how his disciples are to wait for his return. Like a boss out of the office, right now Jesus is physically 'away'. So, what do we do? Jesus tells a parable where three servants are entrusted with 3 different amounts of money to invest and make a return on (Matt 25:14-30). Two of them go get to work, and double what they had. When the master returns, they receive a wonderful commendation. But the third servant does, well, nothing. He just buries what he was given, and probably enjoys his days on the golf course! But the master does return and says he is "wicked and lazy," and he is to be thrown outside.

Like the master in the parable, Jesus cares very much that his 'assets' belonging to him are grown. And what is that? The most simple answer, I think, is: the church. Not meaning these physical buildings, but people who know and trust Jesus. And Jesus has entrusted to us the means of growing his church: Spirit-empowered, prayer-based sharing of his Word. Now of course, just as the servants in the parable are given different amounts, we are all given different opportunities for growing the church. The question isn't what we're given, but what will we do with what we're given? Is it possible that we might be living like the servant who just buried his bag of gold, going off to do our own things? If so, we need to hear Jesus' warning. But in telling this parable, Jesus also gives great encouragement. To everyone who knows him and seeks to live for him, you can be assured the day will come when he will say, 'well done, good and faithful servant.... come and share your master's happiness.' And your share in his happiness will be great indeed.

One of the things I love about Christmas time is the many opportunities it gives us to very naturally share of Christ, or extend an invitation, or pray for others, and more. So, this Christmas, how might we prayerfully seek to grow Christ's church?
