Dear brothers and sisters,

Here we are screeching into Christmas just a week away! Here are a few questions which may be helpful for us as we do so:

How might we adore Christ this Christmas?

Matthew 2:11 "they [the Magi] bowed down and worshipped him".

It's so easy for all our attention to be consumed by the busyness, gifts and food. But at the heart of Christmas is the good news of God fulfilling his promises to send a King who "will reign on David's throne and over his kingdom, establishing and upholding it with justice and righteousness" (Isa 9:7). The babe in a manger is also the King worthy of our adoration and worship and obedience. How might we "come" and "adore him" this Christmas?

How might we rejoice this Christmas?

Luke 2:10 "I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all the people". Christmas can often be a time of disappointments and sadnesses. It is easy to look at our circumstances (or compare them to others as curated on social media!) and grumble. How good to bring into view the bigger Christmas news that "a Saviour has been born to you" (Luke 2:10). How might we instead cultivate and express our thankfulness and "great joy"?

How might we give this Christmas?

John 3:16 "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son..." Christmas is supposedly a time of 'goodwill' to others. But why? For us who know God's indescribable gift in giving us Jesus, we have the best motivation to give to others, whether in hospitality or care or gifts or more. So, to our friends, family, neighbours, community-members, are there ways we can express the generous love of God this Christmas?

How we share the good news this Christmas?

Luke 2:17 "[the shepherds] spread the word concerning what had been told them about this child".

We have something much better than Santa to celebrate and make known! In Christ God has given us a Saviour, who does not reward us for being 'good', but the opposite, "saves his people from their sins." So please do be praying for opportunities to share of Christ this Christmas. Perhaps for those informal conversations with friends or family we gather with? Perhaps in a thoughtful social media post? Perhaps in invitations to our Christmas Eve or Christmas Day services we could extend to neighbours or friends?
