The Great Rescue

Dear brothers and sisters,

What do you think you need rescuing from? We might think we need saving from lots of things:

- from rising interest rates, and the financial squeeze;
- from that work deadline, or that illness, or that difficult relationship;
- from climate change, or over-development or corporate greed; or much more.
 And those things are genuine and valid concerns. Yet in our passage today Paul sets out what the Bible says is the most serious and fundamental thing we need rescuing from.

In Romans 1:16-17, Paul said "I am not ashamed of the gospel, because it is the power of God that brings *salvation* to everyone who believes." And that raises the question: *Salvation* – or rescue - from what?

The answer is in the very next verse: "For, the wrath of God is being revealed from heaven against all the godlessness and wickedness of people." (Romans 1:18). That might not sound very PC, but according to the Bible what we most need saving from is God's anger at human sin. Paul then spends the next two chapters exposing how all people, Jew and Gentile, religious and non-religious, are given over to sin and so need rescue from God's wrath.

And to be honest, it is pretty dark reading. In our reading today, Romans 1:18-32, Paul shows how Gentile (today we might apply it as, non-religious) rightly stand under God's wrath. Paul shows there is a fundamental problem both in their relationship with God and their relationships with one another. Some of what he says there is deeply counter-cultural and sensitive to us today, especially about sexuality – so can I say, please do come and speak with me or others here if you would like to talk about these things more. But Paul's big point isn't to single out one thing as worse than another, but to show that all of Gentile (non-religious) society is given to sin and rightly under God's wrath. And indeed, the same sober reality is true still today for us and those around us.

But remember, like putting a black cloth behind a diamond to show it more clearly, Paul is exposing the darkness of human sin only so that we might see more clearly the brilliance of Jesus and the salvation he offers, to everyone who believes. That salvation which is offered no less today to us and those around us. Praise God! Is that a rescue you know and have experienced yourself?

My family participated as leaders on Glen Echo 1, a camp held on a farm in Albany where 30 teenagers spent a week climbing mountains, kayaking, swimming and going on an adventure of the heart as they discovered more about God's love for them. Like the other camps operating around the country, the chance for children to encounter Christian community is transformational. It was such a blessing for our family to have this refreshing start to the year, encouraging us to continue to trust in the Lord and his never stopping, never giving up, unbreaking, always and forever love.
