But Now.

Have you had the experience of being or feeling like you were in an impossible situation, but then someone came along and was able to help? Like being broken down on the side of the road in the middle of the night and a dead phone – and then someone driving past, stopping, and getting you to safety? Or like being unemployed and on the streets – but then someone giving you a job and place to stay. Paul explains something like that happening in our passage today – only far more significantly.

In Romans chapters 1 and 2 he pressed the point that Gentiles and Jews, the irreligious and religious, seemingly good and seemingly bad, are all in fact facing the rightful wrath of God on their sin. As Paul concludes in chapter 3: "There is no one righteous, not even one." (Rom 3:10) Before God, our sin means we are in an impossible, hopeless situation: guilty and deserving his wrath. "But now". (v.21) But. Now. Those words usher in a vista of light and hope into the darkness of our sin-induced predicament. "But now apart from the Law the righteousness of God has been made known... this righteousness is given through faith in Christ Jesus to all who believe." (v.21-22) A righteousness is available, freely – not a self-righteousness based on our (failed) efforts to be good or religious, but a true righteousness given through Jesus. Now, instead of being under God's wrath and condemnation, we can be "justified", declared 'in the right' by God our judge.

But how? As one person has asked: 'How could God be right and declare right those who are not right?' How can God declare sinners not guilty and right before him? Answer: Jesus' death on the cross. "God presented Christ as a sacrifice of atonement through the shedding of his blood." (v.25) Jesus' death was the intentional sacrifice whereby God's anger at sin might be turned away from us. At the cross, the blowtorch of God's anger was turned on himself. Our sin atoned for.

It is true that "all have sinned". There is no one who is too good to need salvation - even us. But it is also true that "all are justified freely by his grace" (v.25). There is no one too bad to be saved – even us. As we sing (Before the Throne of God Above):

'Because the sinless saviour died, my sinful soul is counted free, For God the just is satisfied, to look on him and pardon me.'

MISSION PROJECT UPDATE Information for your Prayers



Barnabas Fund (barnabasfund.org/au)

Barnabas is an interdenominational organisation dedicated to meeting the practical and spiritual needs of Christians experiencing persecution and discrimination. Help is supplied from Christians, to Christians, by Christians. Village leaders and residents tore down a private home where Christians were gathered for worship in rural Laos in violation of the constitution. Please pray that the law will be upheld. In Pakistan, after a Muslim mob rampaged through a Punjabi city Christian area, burning dozens of churches, the Supreme Court has found an organised cover up. Barnabas has been supplying aid for many Christian families made homeless, including warm quilts and food. Islamists have boasted of killing ten Christians in a series of attacks waged over two weeks against Christian villages in northern Mozambique. They base this on the Koran (Q 9.5). Around 45,000 believers have been killed in Nigeria since 2009. Please pray for divine mercy on the persecuted church globally.
