State House Lobby Day: May 25th

Support for Fair Home Appraisals & Equitable Juries

LWVNJ will join advocates and leaders from across the state in Trenton on May 25th to urge lawmakers to pass the Fair Appraisals Bill (A1519/S777) to combat appraisal discrimination and A977/S3043 to allow people with criminal convictions to serve on juries.

It is time for New Jersey to create intentional policies to combat systemic discrimination, which has had devastating and disproportionate impacts on Black and other communities of color.

Pass a Local Resolution

Help the campaign for a NJ Green Amendment and the campaign for a NJ Reparations Task Force by organizing for a local resolution in your town or county!

New Jersey Green Amendment Local Resolution:

- <u>ACR72/SCR15</u> amends the NJ constitution granting everyone in the state the right to pure water, clean air, a stable climate & healthy environment.
- <u>Review this local resolutions toolkit</u> and email <u>Melissa Marks</u> for support passing a resolution in support of the NJ Green Amendment.

New Jersey Reparations Task Force Local Resolution:

- A938/S386, would establish a New Jersey Reparations Task Force to examine the history of slavery and its aftermath and make policy recommendations to address New Jersey's racial inequities.

UPDATES FROM TRENTON



Ending Gun Violence

The League's Democracy Policy Analyst, Philip Hensley, delivered remarks at a rally organized by March for Our Lives - NJ on the issues of **gun violence** and police brutality.

Budget Advocacy

League staff delivered testimony on the Governor's budget proposal, incorporating budget requests from numerous program committees and advancing League priorities, including a request for \$20 million for voter education for the Division of Elections.



<u>Fighting for an Equitable Tax</u> Code

The League joined with our For The Many coalition partners to lobby for an **equitable tax code** and against the proposed reduction in the Corporate Business Tax surcharge.

The League signed on to numerous joint letters and League staff participated in lobbying meetings with legislators and rallies in Newark.



Testimony on Election Bills

On behalf of the League, Philip Hensley testified in support of the following bills:

- A5176: A bill which would require consistent county and statewide reporting of unofficial elections results. This bill would bring consistency and transparency to elections reporting.
- A5362: A bill that would increase funding for the New Jersey Election Law Enforcement Commission (ELEC).
- A3690: A bill that would allow 17 year-olds to vote in party primaries, if they would turn 18 by the date of the general election ("New Voter Empowerment Act").

Stay tuned for additional updates as these bills advance through the legislature.



Civic Health Month

The League also submitted testimony in support of SJR 100/AJR 196, designating the month of August as "Civic Health Month" in New Jersey, highlighting the connections between civic participation and health, especially the social determinants of health.

Environmental Justice

The League's Natural Resources Committee submitted written comments in opposition to Competitive Power Venture's (CPV) proposal for a new **Keasbey Energy Center.**

Reproductive Equity

Jani Vinick, a member of the League's Women & Family Issues Committee, delivered testimony at the Assembly Women & Children Committee in support of A1349 the **Menstrual Equity Bill**. A1349 passed out of committee, and we look forward to continuing to advocate for the bill's passage.

The League signed onto a THRIVE Coalition letter to Governor Murphy and NJ legislative leadership calling on the state to allocate state **funds to support abortion providers** and **expand coverage** for reproductive health care services, pass the **Reproductive Equity Act**, and **pass S3275/A4829**
