Who is running?

All congressional representatives and one senate seat are on the ballot. Some local offices are up for election too, like mayor, county commissioners and school board members. Visit Vote411.org to view the races in your district.



Why vote?

Turnout in primary elections is often very low, but primaries are when we decide who will be on the ballot in November representing our party. Research your whole ballot. Local officials have a large impact on our daily lives. Your vote is your voice. Make your voice heard and cast your ballot!

There are important issues on the table including education, the economy, the environment, and voting rights. Whatever the issue is that you care about, you can vote about it. Research your candidates to see where they stand.

New Jersey voters have 3 ways to vote in the upcoming election:

1. Vote in-person on Election Day, June 4, 2024 at your designated polling location.
 2. Vote in-person early at one of your county's early voting sites from May 29, 2024 - June 2 2024.
 3. Vote using a Vote-By-Mail Ballot and return it in the mail, drop it in a secure drop box in your county, or deliver it in-person to your County Board of Elections office.
