Governors are members of Milton Keynes University Hospital NHS Foundation Trust who have been elected to represent the views of the public in order to influence and help shape the way our services are delivered to patients, making a valuable contribution to the way the hospital is run and the Trust's future plans.

What do hospital governors do?

- Listen to people's views about the hospital and represent them on the Council of Governors
- Provide opportunities for people to talk with them ea stalls, governor surgeries, events
- Hold the Trust's Non-Executive Directors to account

Who is my local governor?

There are 15 local constituency seats to which governors are elected, as well 4 appointed governor seats.
