Minutes of the meeting of the **Recs and Services Committee** held at The Olney Centre on **Monday 21**st **November 2022 at 7pm**

RS22/11/1: Apologies for absence

Resolved: Apologies were received from Cllrs Brock, Brown and Rodden

RS22/011/2: Declarations of interests on items on the agenda

Resolved: Cllr Stokes declared a possible interest in item 14 as a user of the recreation grounds

RS22/11/3: To approve the minutes of the meeting held on 11th July 2022

Resolved: Cllr Whitworth proposed, Cllr Stokes seconded that the minutes of 11th July be

approved, all in favour.

RS22/11/4: To receive a presentation from "Lace and Grace" artwork

Steve Pardue introduced himself as the artist who had been approached by Vistry Homes to commission an art installation at the new Yardley Manor estate. He worked on two important themes from Olney, the lace making industry and the Amazing Grace hymn. He has designed a 5m sculpture as the gateway to the new community centre, weaving lace patterns and words from the hymn on it. Looking at different materials and possible smaller scale replicas to link the new estate with the old part of town.

RS22/11/5: To approve to investigate options for a running track in Olney

Cllr Bethune to investigate if there is a demand for the facility, clerk to approach schools to see if they would be interested in one being on their land, investigate price, maintenance costs and viability if a location can be found.

RS22/011/6: To approve implementation of parking charges at East Street car park

Resolved: Cllr Bethune proposed, Cllr Varley seconded that we do not implement parking charges at the East Street car park.

Clerk to investigate replacing the hanging baskets and replacing the liners in the existing ones.

RS22/11/8: To select resurfacing quotes for allotment lane and East Street car park Clerk to employ Stuart Thomas for advice to validate the spend and return to full council.

RS22/11/9: To receive an update on the Olney Speedwatch

The report was noted. Clerk to request from MKCC that 20mph be in place outside the Infant and Middle schools, play areas and residential streets.

RS22/11/10: To approve applying for section 106 money to fund a metalwork bench designed and crafted by a local artist for the Barnfield

Resolved: to investigate a very large tree trunk be installed for sitting on.

RS22/11/11: To approve investigating the cost of public wifi at the Market Place

Resolved: Cllr Bethune proposed, Cllr Rowland seconded that clerk to investigate the cost of wifi at the Market Place, all in favour.

Clerk to approach Parks Trust for advice.

Resolved: To keep the £3k cost in the budget for next year, but to trial stopping the supply.

Resolved: Clerk to respond to private coaches charging to use the rec to see PL, full RA, enhanced DBS and qualifications before permission may be granted and a cost is allocated.

RS22/11/15: To approve funding for the valuation of the East Street building

Resolved: Cllr Geary proposed, Cllr Rowland seconded that an agent is employed to negotiate a commercial rent and terms. The new rate to be set aside to deal with the dilapidating building as required. All in favour with 1 abstention.

RS22/11/16: To consider budget requirements for 2023-2024

Waste Collection, add 25% from 2022
Resurface car park
Wifi at Market Place
Speed cameras
