


- What is a parable (vs. a fairy tale, story, etc.)?

- What makes a story engaging + relatable?




INVITE

Parable of Prodigal Son




Return of Prodigal Son (Rembrandt)






NURTURE

There once was an orphaned boy named Kai. He was sent to Tokyo to live with his grandfather. Kai's grandfather taught him karate because he was a former karate champion.





Each of my Bible classes gave feedback to the other classes. They learned how to give kind and specific feedback.





THE ARTIST AND HER FRIEND

THERE ONCE WAS A GIRL WITH A MAGICAL SKETCHBOOK. SHE DRAWS A FOREST JUST THE WAY SHE WANTS IT, PERFECTLY. AFTER DRAWING FOR HOURS, SHE FALLS ASLEEP. WAKING UP, SHE SEES EVERYTHING IN HER CREATION. DAYS GO BY AND THE GIRL DECIDES SHE WANTS TO SHARE IT WITH SOMEONE ELSE. SHE PICKS UP THE PENCIL AND DRAWS A FRIEND WHO LOOKS LIKE HER, HOLDING AN ART KIT. THE ARTIST CALLS HER "CECILIA". CECILIA AND HER CREATOR ARE VERY SIMILAR, BUT CECILIA IS ALWAYS JEALOUS OF HOW THE ARTIST CAN DRAW ANYTHING AND IT WILL COME TO LIFE BUT CECILIA'S DRAWINGS CAN'T COME TO LIFE. ANYTIME CECILIA TRIES TO MAKE HER DRAWING COME TO LIFE, SHE FAILS.

CECILIA SEES HER FRIEND'S ERASER WHICH IS FORBIDDEN FROM HER. SHE IS
TEMPTED, PICKS IT UP AND ANGRILY STARTS ERASING THE THINGS HER CREATOR HAS MADE.
TOO LATE, THE GIRL REALIZES HER MISTAKE AND THAT THE ARTIST WILL SOON DISCOVER
WHAT SHE HAS DONE. WHAT THE GIRL DOESN'T KNOW IS THAT THE ARTIST HAS BEEN
WATCHING THE WHOLE TIME AND HAS SEEN EVERYTHING.

THE ARTIST APPROACHES HER, LOOKING AT THE GROUND AND SEES THE ERASER.

CECELIA ASKS HER FRIEND TO FORGIVE HER AND REPENTS FOR WHAT SHE HAS DONE. THE

Student Reflections: Questions Asked

- What did your group do well in communicating with each other?
- What was the hardest part of the activity for you?
- How could you have been a better follower?
- How could you have been a better leader?
- What was your biggest moment of learning/impact?



Student Reflections: Responses

- The most profound responses came to the questions "How could I have been a better shepherd?" and "How could I have been a better follower?"
- There were a lot of responses that related to listening to the people around them and not just trying to talk over them or shout them down. As a leader, they should seek out the opinions of others, listen to those opinions, and make a place for everyone in the group to have a voice. They talked also about being willing to listen to what others were saying and being willing to do what someone else wanted to do not just what they wanted, sacrificing their own desires for the group in order to follow someone else's.



Teacher Reflections:

- Debriefing with students at different points was important
 - To deal with conflict (e.g. want to separate from group)
 - To draw out/emphasize certain conclusions
 - Use questions to make points
- Vital to give students freedom to struggle/fail
- "Real Work" is really important
 - They have to see/feel it actually means something
 - "Outside audience"



Additional Information to tell the story:

- One parable was used in teaching Elementary Chapel
 - Next year: students will present in younger chapels

- Feedback & revision were very helpful in shepherding
 - Students more impacted by peer feedback (positive and negat
 - Teacher helped guide students when stuck
