Hotels that know what guests crave

Once upon a time, a TV in your hotel room was a cool perk. These days, in-room blow dryers and free bicycles no longer cut it. Hotels spend billions on carefully curated amenities and cool activities designed to keep guests coming back. Here are four places where you can indulge.

Lake Tahoe, Nev.

Waking up in paradise is even easier, thanks to Edgewood Tahoe's Après Sleep Cart, designed to spur a soothing start to the day. It's stocked with freshly brewed Naturopathica tea infused with healing extracts, rose geranium mist, homemade granola and juice. Guests are primed to glide right into their daily Mindful Mountain Yoga class with views of the lake and majestic pine trees. Rooms start at \$249 a

Aspen, Colo.

A 54-foot indoor rock climbing wall, ice skating, snowshoeing and fatbiking (oversized tires that work on snow) are some of the highlights at the new Limelight Hotel Snowmass. Top off the adventures at the marshmallow-shaped s'mores carts that are steps away at Base Village and Snowmass Mall from 3:30 to 4:30 p.m. daily throughout the winter. Rooms from \$350 a night.

Amsterdam

Pulitzer Amsterdam gives a daily guided tour of 17th and 18th century canal houses and their famous inhabitants, including Rembrandt. Kids also receive pillowcases personalized with their name and hobby, a new bedtime story placed on the pillows each night and a treasure hunt with a prize at the end, among the programs just for them. Rooms from \$335 a night.

Paso Robles, Calif.

Allegretto Vineyard Resort houses one of the most robust art collections in the area, with daily, docent-led tours. Tandem bikes for cruising the vineyards, chef-accompanied garden tours and the world's first sonic labyrinth featuring tones created by wind instruments are among other offerings. Rooms from \$270 a night.

Rewards are in the cards

Those airline flights, hotel rooms and meals out can pay off more than ever this year with new loyalty programs. Here's what to watch for.

With a new year come new opportunities to save on travel with credit card miles and points — cash back, bonus points and statement credits on certain purchases. The world of points and miles can be tricky to navigate, which means you could miss out on potential savings. Here are some things to keep in mind as you scan the credit card landscape for 2019:

Citi Prestige revamp

The Citi Prestige card has pumped up its benefits for the new year, propelling it higher in the echelon of luxury-tier credit cards such as American Express Platinum and Chase Sapphire Reserve. The card now offers quintuple points on dining and travel and triple points on cruise lines and hotels

Not all the changes are positive. The card's annual fee will increase \$45 to \$495 in September, and the card's unlimited complimentary-fourthnight benefit will be curtailed to just two uses per year.

The other caveat: The card is not currently accepting applications. Although several travel blogs had reported that applications would reopen in January (and with, in theory, a nice sign-up bonus), when I called the Citi application center ([800] 456-4277), neither the representative nor her supervisor could confirm when the card would be accepting applications again.

Dining and delivery perks

The American Express Gold Card has a new look and different benefits as of fall 2018, the most noteworthy of which — quadruple points on restaurants — will excite those who dine out frequently.

The card, which has a 35,000-point public sign-up bonus after spending \$2,000 in the first three months and an annual fee of \$250, also offers a monthly \$10 credit for a handful of dining and food-delivery partners, including Grubhub, Seamless and Shake Shack.

But be aware: Some cardholders have reported not consistently getting quadruple points when dining out. You may be in for a chat with customer service to claim those missing points

Track your categories

Several credit cards, including the Citi Dividend, Chase Freedom and Discover it cards, offer a rotating quarterly selection of categories that give you 5% back, including gas, airlines and wholesale clubs. Save yourself some time (and money) by making a note of when the categories that are the most potentially lucrative for you fall on the calendar.

Discover and Citi have already released their categories for the year, allowing you to plan for big purchases.

Citi Dividend, for example, gives 5% back on airline purchases in July, August and September. If, come June, you find yourself about to pull the trigger on plane tickets to Europe for the fall, it might pay off to wait until July 1 so you can take advantage of the 5% offer.

Chase Freedom, unfortunately, keeps its categories closer to the vest and reveals them three months at a time; for the first quarter of 2019, it's gas stations, tolls and drugstores.

Say bonjour to Bonvoy

The big Marriott news (aside from the massive data breach of its Starwood reservation system that compromised the data of nearly 383 million people) is its rolling together of the Marriott, Starwood and Ritz-Carlton rewards programs into one giant entity now known as Bonvoy (as in "bon voyage").

Bonvoy is expected to introduce a handful of new credit cards with the Bonvoy branding through Chase and American Express in February.

Chase's Marriott Premier Plus card will soon be known as the Marriott Bonvoy Boundless card and will offer a substantial 100,000-point signup bonus when it officially launches Feb. 28. That's currently enough points to get you five nights in a Category 4 hotel. (By comparison, Category 7 contains Ritz-Carltons.)

Take along a friend

The Southwest Airlines Companion Pass is one of the great deals in all of flying: When you buy a ticket on Southwest, you get to bring a designated companion for free, plus \$5.60 in taxes and fees each way.

If you're not a road warrior, the Companion Pass can be tough to land. It requires 100 flight segments or the accumulation of 110,000 points. Credit card sign-up bonuses, fortunately, count toward that point total, but typically require opening more than one credit card.

For a limited time, three Southwest Rapid Rewards cards — Plus, Premium and Priority — are offering a free companion pass, good through the end of the year, plus 30,000 Rapid Rewards points as a sign-up bonus after you spend \$4,000 in the first three months. Think of it as a great opportunity to take yourself and a friend or loved one on a nice getaway.

SCOTLAND, SCANDINAVIA

An Arctic island adventure
