HIGHLIGHTS

2022/23 FISCAL YEAR PRE-BUDGET CONSULTATIONS AT BICC

ECAMA consolidated all the suggestions that it received from the Membership and presented the following:

Expectations

- The budget should be largely aligned with MIP-1 of Malawi 2063, with any deviations clearly justified.
- Private-sector growth must be promoted through conducive policies and public sector investment.
- Effective budget implementation, because a budget is only as good as its implementation.
- Transparency in budget implementation.
- A realistic macroeconomic environment.

Tax measures and administration

- The government should reconsider dutyfree week.
- Consider tax measures to support digitization.
- Clear, predictable, consistent, and well-targeted investment tax breaks.
- Customs charges must be applied correctly or consistently by MRA.
- The punitive PAYE tax brackets should be reconsidered.

Expenditure measures

- Allocations of expenditure should be aligned with MW2063.
- Prioritize areas that will support higher growth.
- Reforms in agricultural subsidies are required.
- Invest in education and health in accordance with MW2063.
- Prioritize development expenditure on the basis of cost effectiveness.

Fiscal deficit

- The government must develop a clear exit strategy from the persistent deficits and growing debt stock.
- Given the limited fiscal space, there is a need to improve revenue mobilization and prioritize expenditures.

Other policy issues

- Implement policies to promote exports and reduce imports.
- Manage exchange rates.
- Import substitution to support domestic production.
- Friendly immigration protocols for a favorable investment climate.

ECAMA PARTICIPATES IN "MALAWI WANGA PROGRAM"

On 27th January 2022, ECAMA took part in a financial and economic literacy discussion on inflation, a recorded TV program. Panelists discussed various concepts on inflation, including causes of inflation and the role of government in containing inflation.

The recording was in Chichewa. The goal was to help every Malawian understand what was being discussed.

The Financial and Economic Literacy sessions are an initiative by the Ministry of National Unity through its Government - Citizen Engagement Platform, "Pabwalo".
